- These gardens are primarily located in LMI areas, areas of high food insecurity, and/or food deserts.
- With the onset of the COVID-19 worldwide pandemic, we are experiencing growing food insecurity.
- These areas are especially vulnerable to outside stresses.
- Unemployment is currently more than 15%.

- Riviera Beach is under a stay at home order, except for essential services; these restrictions have been eased for limited access to our parks and waterways.
- Residents have limited access to fresh, wholesome foods; grocery shelves are often bare of even essentials, including meat, milk, bread, and fresh produce.



- While we continue to make produce available to residents, we need to do more.
- We propose an expansion to our gardening outreach to include a Backyard Garden Project.
- The Backyard Garden Project would have several components:
 - "Weekend Gardener"
 Program
 - "Gardenista" Program
 - "Urban Master"
 Program



- "Weekend" Gardener Program:
 - Small container
 - Enriched soil
 - Tools
 - Gloves
 - Watering Can
 - Seedlings and seeds
 - Instructions

- Components:
 - Simple pre-registration
 - Resident drive up to Demo garden
 - Loaded into vehicle
 - Checklist
 - Post-grow survey
- Implementation:
 - By June 1st
- Budget:
 - \$10,000
 - 75-100 families



- "Gardenista" Program:
 - Larger raised bed (s)
 - Enriched soil
 - Tools
 - Gloves
 - Drip irrigation system and pump
 - Seedlings and seeds
 - Poles and screening
 - Instructions

• Components:

- Simple pre-registration
- Resident drive up to Demo garden/assistance if needed
- Loaded into vehicle
- Checklist
- Post-grow survey
- Implementation:
 - By June 15th
- Budget:
 - \$7,500
 - 25-30 families



- "Urban Master" Program:
 - Larger raised bed (s)
 - Enriched soil
 - Tools
 - Gloves
 - Drip irrigation system and pump
 - Rain barrel and gutter system
 - Seedlings and seeds
 - Poles and screening
 - Instructions

• Components:

- Simple pre-registration
- Partnership with RB Water Utilities
- Master gardener setup at home
- Checklist and agreement
- Post-grow survey and pics
- Implementation:
 - By July 1st
- Budget:
 - \$5,000
 - 8-10 families



- Other components needed:
 - Bed liner
 - Soil
 - Tools
 - Seeds/Seedlings
 - Marketing
- Budget Other
 - \$5,000

- Implementation:
 - By June September
 - Project Manager : RBCDC
- Budget:
 - \$27,500
 - Impact 560-700 people or \$39/person



Recommendation: Approval of the Backyard Garden Program; to be implemented immediately at an estimated cost of \$27,500.
