143 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Madam Chair and Board of Directors, I wanted 144 to acknowledge Mr. Foster, and also Lennar Homes, and 13<sup>th</sup> Floor Development that are 145 with us on this call. We really appreciate their, their teamwork and efforts.

146 Madam Chair and Board [stammer].., Board of Directors, back in 2018, Arbor Parc 147 Developers submitted plans to development serviced and the District. There were some modifications made of the original submissions of those plans. Such as, the removal of 148 149 key protection devices and some plan changes. The changes were made after the 150 original plans were submitted and improved, as with most engineering designing contracts, another step in submitting the development plans, is the application process 151 with the Florida Health Department and the Florida Environmental Protect Agency. These 152 applications were originally submitted explaining that the District would take ownership of 153 the property. There have been several inconsistencies between the departments and 154 155 developers. And over a period of several weeks, lately, we have worked with crossfunctional teams in Development Services, the City Attorney's Office and the City 156 157 Manager's Office, and this District and have come to a great understanding of how to solve this ongoing issue. 158

159 With that said, Ms. Busby will brief you on [inaudible].

160Chairperson Botel:Thank you.Ms. Busby.Thank you.[Pause].Your161microphone.

162 Assistant District Attorney Busby: Thank you. Thank you...

163 **Chairperson Botel:** Thank you.

Assistant District Attorney Busby: ...for that. Good evening, Mayor, City Council,
 Chair.

We did work closely with the Utility Special District on drafting this 166 Yes. Memorandum of Understanding. This is considered a legal document, but I would stress 167 168 that it is an outline for action that the Utility District intends to take and explore and present to the Special Utility District Board for its consideration. The City and developer are 169 170 essentially agreeing to work in good faith to resolve the particular matters that are listed 171 in this MOU, and outlined. However, it is not a contract and I want that to be clear this evening. Nothing contained herein will create a binding obligation on either party and the 172 173 terms contained, or referenced, are not fixed and they remain open for negotiations. So, 174 I stress that notion for your consideration this evening.

175 Thank you.

176 **Chairperson Botel:** Thank you. Thank you.

**Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** So, we believe that the MOU spells out what the deliverables are to be expected between the District and the developers, and when.., and which team players are directly responsible for those deliverables. Through this development, the District is already servicing existing customers under temporary Certificates of Occupancy, which will later turn into Certificates of Occupancy, once all the perimeters in the MOU have been met and this Board approves the District taking over this particular development.

184 There are some risks that I think.., that are important that the Board should be 185 aware of. We are evaluating Phase 1... I'm sorry, sir.

186Chairperson Botel:Dr. Johnson, Mr. McCoy has a, a question.You're187recognized, Mr. McCoy.

**Board Member McCoy:** Thank you, Madam Chair. Dr. Johnson, can you be descriptive when you say the District taking over this because we're talking about two different Districts, Utility Special District and then also Mediterranea Community Development District, so make sure that you're very clear when you're explaining this because I'm not sure which District are you saying that's going to be taking over something. 194 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** We, we cannot take over any development 195 without the Board's approval. So the Memorandum of Unders'...

Board Member McCoy: [Inaudible], Mr., Dr. Johnson. When you say Board, I wanna
 make sure I'm understanding precisely, are you talking about Mediterranea Community
 Development District Board or Utility Special District's Board? So.

Executive Director of Utility Johnson: So, but, we did want to mention that there are some risks that the Board should be aware of. We're evaluating Phase 1, during this process. And also, we're going to ensure that the water and sewer in Phase 1 is in [inaudible] industry standards, and District standards.

220 So with that, Madam Chair, we would ask that the Council would consider this 221 Memorandum of Understanding for approval.

- District Clerk Anthony: Madam Chair, Members of the Board, we do not have any public comments at this time. Public comments on this Item is now closed.
- 275 Board Member McCoy: So moved.
- 276 **Chairperson Botel:** Thank you. Madam Clerk, would you...

Board Member Miller-Anderson: Thank you. We need a motion and a second.
Madam Clerk, would you please let the record show that Council'.., Board Member Lanier
is on the dais. Thank you.

280 **District Clerk Anthony:** Thank you, Madam Chair.

281 **Chairperson Botel:** So, we had a motion and a second. And, Mr., Dr. Johnson, 282 do you have a... Or, this looks like you want.., you would like Jonathan Batista to present?

**Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Yes. But before Mr. Batista talks, the Florida statute 252.38 in terms of emergency management acts allows municipalities to perform actions that is believed to be a threat to public health, to the environment and to the property. And, Mr. Batista is going to get into specifics of what was done that we're coming back to Council to ask to ratify these actions.

288 Mr. Batista.

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289 Assistant Executive Director of Utilities Batista: So, originally GlobalTech was 290 hired to rehabilitate lime softening unit number 3 and they have successfully done so. 291 The unit is just about to go into operation. However, in the original scope of their work, it 292 didn't cover all items that needed to be addressed before the lime softening unit could be 293 fully operational. Some of those items include, there was no lime system feeding the 294 new.., or, the new.., newly rehabilitated softener because the north chemical building, 295 which originally fed lime to the softener is no longer providing..., or has the capability to 296 provide lime to the unit. So, therefore, the emergency justification includes a temporary 297 lime system to be able to provide lime to the softening unit. Without lime, the unit cannot 298 do the softening process.

299 Additionally, it was found that there was no influent connected to the softener, 300 which means that it would be impossible to feed raw water into the softener and have it 301 treat the raw water. And also, there were lines that needed to be connected for chlorine 302 and ammonia. So, this emergency justification allows us to do all that work very guickly, have all these different systems connected and provide the lime softening unit, complete 303 functionality to begin treating the water. And by doing so, it prevents raw water from being 304 305 bypassed and treats that raw water that was previously bypassed and the water quality 306 would substantially improve after that happens.

- 307 Chairperson Botel: We, we applaud that idea. Any ques'... Are you finished, Mr.
  308 Batista?
- 309 Assistant Executive Director of Utilities Batista: Yes.
- 310Chairperson Botel:Any questions?Mr. McCoy, you're recognized.[Pause].311Your microphone, Mr. McCoy.[Pause].Mr. McCoy, we're not hearing you.

**Board Member McCoy:** Thank you. I, I'm sorry. So, if this is a justification under Florida statute 252.38 regarding emergency procedures, why exactly do we need to do a justification if it's already called out that these can be procured just by merely the fact that it's an emergency dealing with Public Works? Or Utilities?

- 316 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Well...
- 317 Board Member McCoy: Seems like...
- 318 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Mr. McCoy? Madam Chair?
- 319 **Chairperson Botel:** You're recognized, Dr. Johnson.

320 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Mr. McCoy, we realized that we could perform

any actions, but because it rolls over the threshold of approval, we set out to come backto the Board for ratification of those [inaudible].

**Board Member McCoy:** Thank you for your explanation but specifically, this statute authorized, because of the emergency nature of Public Works, that you would kinda have to suggest or even infer that this supersedes our local procurement. And, I mean, I, I

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don't wanna have a special meeting to do something that is an emergency of.., of an
emergency nature when statute provides that we can do it. And it would commonly seem,
Ms. Wynn, help me if I'm incorrect, that this statute would supersede our local
procurement policy in any event, being that it's an emergency?

330 District Attorney Wynn: Yeah. I think you're correct except that it's.., this is ratifying 331 the emergency procurement, which I believe they have already procured the services. 332 Correct?

- 333 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Yeah. The services...
- 334 **District Attorney Wynn:** Dr. Johnson?
- 335 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** [Inaudible]...

- 382 **Chairperson Botel:** Would someone... Thank you. Dr. Johnson.

**Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Yes, Madam Chair and Council. This is a continuation of the projects that we have to restore chemical processes that have been either out of service or in need of desperate repair, to improve the water quality to our customers. And, I'll let... If you have any specific questions about this, I'll let Mr. Armstrong address those questions.

388 **Chairperson Botel:** Any questions? Mr. McCoy, you're recognized.

Board Member McCoy: My question is, Mr. Randy Sherman regarding the, the money.
 Not so much the project.

- 391 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Mr. Sherman.
- 392 Board Member McCoy: Mr. Sherman, so...
- **393 District Finance Director Sherman:** Yes.

**Board Member McCoy:** ...last week we, we had this discussion of renewal and replacement versus what's in the CIP. Mr., Dr. Johnson referred to restoring chemical process, so would this be something that's gonna be coming out of the renewal and replacement or capital improvement projects?

- 398 **District Finance Director Sherman:** No. This is actually coming out of the bond 399 proceeds.
- 400 Board Member McCoy: Okay.
- 401 **District Finance Director Sherman:** Of the 2016 period.
- 402 **Board Member McCoy:** So neither.
- 403 District Finance Director Sherman: Correct. And the CIP that was presented on
  404 Saturday incorporated these transfers.
- 405 **Board Member McCoy:** Okay. Thank you.
- 406 **Chairperson Botel:** Anything else? [Pause]. Thank you. Madam Clerk.
- 407 Chair Pro Tem Lawson: Madam Chair?
- 408 **Chairperson Botel:** Oh, I'm sorry. I didn't.., Mr. Lawson, did you have your hand 409 up?
- 410 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** [Chuckle]. I briefly, I briefly raised it but it was...
- 411 **Chairperson Botel:** Sorry.
- 412 Chair Pro Tem Lawson: ...too quick.

419 [Pause]

420 **District Clerk Anthony:** Madam Chair, Members of the Board, I do not see Mr. 421 Armstrong on. I don't know if that is a question that needs to be dir'.., directed at Dr.

- 422 Johnson or Mr. Batista.
- 423 Chair Pro Tem Lawson: Thank you, Madam Clerk. Mr. Johnson?

424 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Yes. Mr. Armstrong was waiting to have the 425 information submitted to him for the minority businesses. I am pretty sure that he received 426 that information so that we could meet the requirements for minority businesses. I can 427 get that information back to you, sir.

428 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** Okay. Yeah. Before I can vote on this Item, I would love to 429 know that information, what amount of this contract is going to local minority and women 430 businesses? What was required with the bid? With the RFP? What was the amount or 431 the percentage that was input into that? So, I would need that information prior to moving 432 forward with my vote.

- 433 Executive Director of Utility Johnson: Councilman Lawson, Mr. Armstrong just walked
   434 into my office.
- 435 **Chairperson Botel:** Oh good.
- 436 Chair Pro Tem Lawson: [Inaudible].
- 437 Executive Director of Utility Johnson: So, there was a question posed and I'll let Mr.
   438 Lawson direct that question to John.
- 439 Chair Pro Tem Lawson: Thank you, Mr. Armstrong. How are you, sir?
- 440 **Senior Utility Engineer Armstrong:** Pretty good. Sorry.
- 441 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** Excellent.
- 442 **Senior Utility Engineer Armstrong:** [Inaudible] to the invite to the meeting so [inaudible].
- 444 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** No worries. Thank you. What amount of this contract, or what 445 portion of this contract involved local women and minority participation?
- 446 **Senior Utility Engineer Armstrong:** I believe it was about ten percent.
- 447 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** Okay. So, ten percent of the total contract is going to 448 minorities, women and local?

- 449 Senior Utility Engineer Armstrong: Yes. About ten percent based on the contract
- 450 price, so it maybe, personalized it may be not exactly ten percent, but based on the math
- 451 [inaudible]...
- 452 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** Okay.
- 453 **Senior Utility Engineer Armstrong:** ...percentage.
- 454 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** And how is that broken... How is that broken down, Mr. 455 Armstrong?
- 456 **Senior Utility Engineer Armstrong:** Yes, sir?
- 457 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** How is that broken down? The ten percent?
- 458 **Senior Utility Engineer Armstrong:** There's different subcontractors, , there's 459 electrical and there's one, Stratton, a local firm here in, in the City that's...
- 460 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** Okay.
- 461 **Senior Utility Engineer Armstrong:** ...minority owned. I don't have those specific 462 numbers in front of me.
- 463 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** But, I guess what I'm asking is, I actually wanted those 464 numbers and that information as to how our local participation is being involved and how 465 they're benefitting from the \$6MM contract. How are women and our small businesses 466 and our minority businesses, how they're going to benefit and be impacted. So, to actually 467 get those numbers is my question. If I could have more..., have a detailed, itemized list of 468 how that was dissected between those businesses and those entities.
- 469 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** We can get that to you, Councilman.
- 470 **Senior Utility Engineer Armstrong:** It's in one of the attachments.
- 471 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** Do you.., is it one of the attachments?
- 472 **Senior Utility Engineer Armstrong:** [Inaudible] one of the larger attach.., 473 attachments, so.
- 474 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** Okay. I'm looking for it now. And then, the primes and sub-475 primes, I just kinda wanted to see an idea of who was actually involved in those.
- 476 Senior Utility Engineer Armstrong: I don't have those specific numbers right in front
   477 of me here.
- 478 Chair Pro Tem Lawson: Okay. So, I, I guess... This is my concern and, and moving
  479 forward, my idea and, Mr. Evans, as you know, local women and minority participation, I,
  480 I really wanna have that understood and make that a priority because with our community
  481 having the lowest median income in Palm Beach County, we have to really make a

482 conscious effort to address it on every dollar that's going out. I, I love Dr. Botel's program 483 that she did with Palm Beach State College, I love the things that we're doing to 484 incentivize our, our locals, our women, our minorities in educating, business, training, 485 staff, but we also have to provide opportunities. And ten percent, in my mind, is just actually not enough, number one. And, number two, for our Staff not to actually have it 486 487 itemized or broken down as to the primes, sub-primes, and a breakdown of who's actually 488 being done. But, I'll address that a little bit more in the Council. But, again, Mr. Johnson, 489 if you can get that information over to me, please?

- 490 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Yes, sir.
- 491 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** Thank you, sir.

492 Senior Utility Engineer Armstrong: If I can add, Chairman Lawson, , the, the City 493 Utility District, Special District went out with an RFQ request for gualifications and design-494 build services and so a couple, a couple weeks ago, a resident who came to the Board 495 to select [inaudible] Committee recommended two design-build companies that there a 496 percentage of [inaudible] participation roughly about the same. One was Global Tech and one was Cardinal and two weeks ago, the Board approved the resident's with, with 497 498 GlobalTech to select two design-build firms [inaudible] and then GlobalTech [inaudible] 499 entered into a contract last week and so you previously approved the idea of the two firms. So, and actually they're the only two firms that submitted ..., respond to the, the 500 Request for Qualifications and their percentage, minority, women [audio skipped] 501 502 enterprise in which [inaudible] about the same.

503 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** Okay. And, and I appreciate them being the only two but we 504 have to make more of a conscious effort for them to bring local and minority participation 505 into the fold. And if we do not make that attempt and that effort, then they'll continue to 506 just give us the bare minimum. So, if we can just make that a priority when we're moving 507 forward with these.

- 508 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Yes, Councilman Lawson.
- 509 Chair Pro Tem Lawson: Okay. Thank you, Mr...
- 510 Chairperson Botel: [Inaudible]...
- 511 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** ...thank you, Dr. Johnson.
- 512 **Chairperson Botel:** Are you finished, Mr. Lawson? Thank you. Mr. McCoy, you're 513 recognized.
- 514 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** Thank you, Madam Chair.
- 515 **Board Member McCoy:** Thank you, Madam Chair. So, Dr. Johnson or Mr. Armstrong, 516 were either of you on the selection committee?

517 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** I was not.

518 Senior Utility Engineer Armstrong: The selection committee included Ms. Jacobs,

- 519 the Water Plant Superintendent, Mr. Danford, and myself, were the three members on
- 520 the selection committee.

521 **Board Member McCoy:** Okay. So Mr. Armstrong, I don't see that.., I've been through 522 at least one of the submittals from Cardinal and they never even responded to the 523 question of whether or not they had a certain minority percentage. But it was asked for 524 in the RFP. So, I, I don't know and I'm just not trying to say it's not there but I don't know 525 how you arrived at ten percent if it's not something that I see in their submittal.

- 526 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Right. And we later challenged them to deliver 527 the information, and the information was, I believe we received it a little later?
- 528 Senior Utility Engineer Armstrong: Yes, sir.
- 529 **Board Member McCoy:** I'm sorry. I couldn't hear that..

530 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Cardinal submitted information just a little bit 1831 later.

532 **Board Member McCoy:** So. Okay. Alright. Good enough. I'm just curious because 533 I, I looked through and I tried to search for those buzz words and nothing in their proposal 534 suggested anything of the sort about minority, or even women businesses. So.., or even 535 subs, for that matter.

536 **Chairperson Botel:** Mr. Batista and then Mr. Lawson. Mr. Sherman, were you 537 trying to say something? Okay. Sorry. I, I didn't see you up there. You might've been 538 first. Let's do Mr. Batista and then Mr. Sherman and then Mr. Lawson to... Thank you.

Assistant Executive Director of Utilities Batista: I quickly went through Novus and
 I found the Exhibit for scheduled payments, which includes information about the minority
 and small businesses. So, I can give more details on those that are involved.

- 542 Chairperson Botel: What Item is it on Novus? [Inaudible]...
- 543 Assistant Executive Director of Utilities Batista: It's...
- 544 Chairperson Botel: ...[inaudible]?
- 545 Assistant Executive Director of Utilities Batista: I believe it's Item No. 5, Exhibit B.

- 546 **Chairperson Botel:** Exhibit B. I got it. Thank you.
- 547 Assistant Executive Director of Utilities Batista: Page No. 7. PDF Page 7.
- 548 [Pause]
- 549 Board Member McCoy: Madam Chair?

- 550 **Chairperson Botel:** Yes, Councilman... I was reading.
- 551 **Board Member McCoy:** Just, just out of curiosity. So, did I hear you say this was sent subsequently, after the initial submittal?
- 553 [Pause]
- 554 **Chairperson Botel:** I think it was Dr. Johnson who said that. Dr. Johnson, did you 555 say this was submitted after the original submittal?
- 556 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Yes. That's what I'm being told by Staff. Yes.
- 557 **Chairperson Botel:** Thank you. Mr. Sherman, can you clarify any of that for us?

558 **District Finance Director Sherman:** Yeah. Well, Batista has pointed you to the same 559 Schedule I [inaudible] locate. Yeah. It's, it's No. 5, Exhibit B. And it's also on the one 560 labelled 7B, BSC, on Page... Let me see. 51. But the one, Exhibit...

- 561 Chairperson Botel: 7B.
- 562 **District Finance Director Sherman:** ...provides the percentages.
- 563 **Chairperson Botel:** [Inaudible]. Exhibit 5, on Page...
- 564 **District Finance Director Sherman:** 7.
- 565 **Chairperson Botel:** 7. Does that answer your question, Mr. Lawson?

566 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** Yes, Madam Chair. So, Cardinal submitted this proposal for 567 MBE, WMBE. The submittal for the other contract, prime contract, do we have that 568 information as to what they submitted in regards to MBE programs?

- 569 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** With GlobalTech?
- 570 Chair Pro Tem Lawson: Yes, sir.
- 571 **Chairperson Botel:** Yes.
- 572 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Jonathan, can you get that information for us?
- 573 Assistant Executive Director of Utilities Batista: MBE for GlobalTech?
- 574 Chairperson Botel: Right.
- 575 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Yes.
- 576 [Pause]
- 577 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Madam Chair?

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- 578 **Chairperson Botel:** Yes, Dr. Johnson.
- 579 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** We can supply this a little later. We don't wanna 580 hold the meeting up? We can supply it before your Council meeting is over.

581 **Chairperson Botel:** Okay. Mr. Lawson, is it alright with you if we move forward 582 and... Do you wanna wait and have this information now?

- 583 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** Yeah. I can't...
- 584 **Chairperson Botel:** [Inaudible].

585 Chair Pro Tem Lawson: ...move forward with this Item prior to having all this information because this..., it has to be a priority on every project, every dollar that's being 586 587 spent in the City. And moving forward, this has to be a primary concern for our entire 588 Staff. We have to address the economics of our community and I'm even looking at these 589 percentage and I'm not even satisfied with this. This is what they submitted and this is 590 what we requested but I wanna see what actual GlobalTech submitted as well because 591 just on the ten percent of this total bid, it's, it's not truly being impactful. So, Madam Chair, 592 you can continue.

593 **Chairperson Botel:** Well, I'm, I'm wondering if.., how the rest of the Board feels. 594 Do you wanna, do you wanna take a vote on this now and then let Mr. Lawson get his 595 information later? Do you feel comfortable enough voting on this now or do you also 596 wanna wait to vote to have that information?

597 Mr. McCoy, how do you feel?

**Board Member McCoy:** Well, before we.., before I answer that, I wanna ask the question, so.., of the selection committee. Was.., who, who was the person that, I guess initially reviewed the submittals to see if all of the Schedules and all of the attachments had been completed and everything that was submitted sufficed as to what the RFQ requested.

- 603 **Chairperson Botel:** Dr. Johnson, do you know the answer to that question? 604 Was., would that have been Mr. Armstrong or Ms. Jacobs or...
- 605 **Board Member McCoy:** Somebody in Procurement I would imagine.
- 606 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** John, who was the person that reviewed all of 607 the documents to make sure that the minority businesses were [inaudible]?
- 608Senior Utility Engineer Armstrong:ThatwasProcurementand[inaudible]609GlobalTech was seven point something percent.
- 610 **Board Member McCoy:** Well, actually it is. I'm looking at it now, it says Ricky Little. 611 So, Senior Procurement Specialist.

But in any event, Board Member Lawson, you know, it's kinda interesting that you bring it up and I totally understand what your concern is, but I don't see that any of the requirements mandated a certain percentage. It only asks that they provide a Letter of Intent to perform as minority subcontractors, and also another Schedule required them to, to, to produce Schedule 1 that says participation for MWBE proposers, for proposers. So, that minority participation doesn't give, in this case, any kind of preference points according to looking at the RFP and also the, the evaluation criteria.

- 619 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** And, to that point, Councilman... I'm sorry. Madam Chair?
- 620 **Chairperson Botel:** You're recognized, Mr. Lawson.

621 Chair Pro Tem Lawson: Thank you. And to that point, Councilman, that is my concerns 'cause we can't mandate MBE requirements without having a disparity study in 622 623 place. That's why I've pushed for us to really move with the disparity study. But getting 624 preference in regards to points for a percentage of minority participation, assists with the 625 actual proposals that comes before the table and will allow for us to select a contractor 626 that will actually give more points and more preference to a MBE and WMB programs. 627 Until we actually implement and pass a disparity study, we can't mandate it but we can give special preferences and put certain requirements in place that allow for them to use 628 629 that process of MBE and WMB.

630 **Chairperson Botel:** Thank you. Mr. Batista, you're recognized, and then Mr. 631 McCoy.

632 Assistant Executive Director of Utilities Batista: Thank you, Madam Chair. I think I have an answer that may resolve both GlobalTech and Cardinal. So, in, in the contract 633 634 that both of them would agree to, in Article 8, SB participation, it states that the contractor 635 is obligated to demonstrate and document a good faith effort toward the obtainment of the fifteen percent SB participation as a condition of this contract. So, essentially, the, 636 637 the contractor has to meet that fifteen percent requirement. And the reason why in that Exhibit, the fifteen percent requirement has not been met yet is because the, the 638 contractor was still working to essentially find the subcontractors to help meet that fifteen 639 640 percent requirement. The scope wasn't completely and fully defined. So, it was an 641 ongoing process and one way or another, that fifteen percent is going to be met.

642 Chairperson Botel: Thank you. Mr. Evans. You're recognized. 643 City Manager Evans: Yes, Madam Chair and Members of the Board. And, and 644 that's why it is so important that we move forward with our agreement with Attorney 645 Franklin Lee that's going to assist in facilitating a program that is more substantive, and he is scheduled to commence work here the first week of September. So, we will be able 646 647 to have a matrix and criteria that will give us at least the starting framework to require 648 more local participation and ensure that reinvestments are occurring in our community. 649 And so, we know that that's something that's near and dear to the, to the Board and so 650 Staff is making sure that that's certainly something that's incorporated.

651 On another related issue, that's why we're actually having him participate in the 652 procurement process for the next Solid Waste provider, to ensure that we take the steps 653 to really move the needle as it relates to minority and, and small business participation 654 on all contracts throughout the City of Riviera Beach.

655 **Chairperson Botel:** Thank you. So, Mr. Lawson.

656 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** A quick comment Mr. Evans, when we have anything that 657 comes before us with procurement, can have our Procurement Director on with us as 658 well? Moving forward?

659 **City Manager Evans:** Absolutely, Councilman. And, and, and one more to that 660 point, I've asked for the Procurement Director for every particular solicitation to be able 661 to provide a chronological update on who [inaudible], how the process started, who was 662 on the selection committee, you know, what was the selection criteria, what were the 663 scoring matrix utilized? All that. So that is going to be part of the memorandum, as well 664 as part of the verbal presentations that you will get as a result of any Item that we procure 665 moving forward.

- 666 **Chair Pro Tem Lawson:** Thank you, Mr. Evans.
- 667 Chairperson Botel: Thank you. Any other questions? I think we'll take the vote,668 Madam Clerk.
- 669 **District Clerk Anthony:** Board Member Miller-Anderson?

# 690DISCUSSION BY THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR OF THE UTILITY SPECIAL DISTRICT691OR THE CITY MANAGER

692

693 Chairperson Botel: Any discussion by the Executive Director of the Utility Special694 District? Dr. Johnson?

695 **Executive Director of Utility Johnson:** Well, I just wanted to have a brief discussion, real quickly. You have already approved the emergency justification, but I just wanted to 696 697 touch on the water quality just a minute, 'cause I know there's some concern for your 698 constituents. So, knowing that the north softener has been out of service for more than 699 four to five years, is what Mr. **Danford** shared with me, and we've been bypassing 700 softener treatment, so what we're doing in this emergency justification is definitely going to improve the water quality that we will see pretty fast. Last week, that number was three 701 702 weeks, and now we should be about at two weeks. GlobalTech is actually onsite 703 performing that work now, as we speak. If there is any delay in that work, we will make 704 sure that we bring that back to the Board and inform the Board. But that is the reason why you've been hearing a lot about the water complaints, the green color, the orange, 705 706 orange color and when we implement these improvements, immediate... immediate 707 change should be taking place. It will take some time to get through the distribution 708 system, but it will be pretty quick.

709 **Chairperson Botel:** Thank you. Dr. Johnson, could you put something in writing 710 to that effect that we can share with our constituents, on our various social media 711 platforms? Just a very quick explanation of what's been done and how it will improve the 712 water quality? That would be helpful to...

- 713 City Manager Evans: Madam'...
