400 City Manager Evans: Madam Chair, and Members of the Board, the Honorable 401 Mayor Ronnie Felder will handle this presentation. 402 Mayor Felder: Thank you, Mr. Evans. 403 Memorial tribute from the Office of the Mayor, City of Riviera Beach, Mayor Felder: 404 Palm Beach County, Florida. 405 In memory of Terrance Denard Holland. 406 We, the City of Riviera Beach, Palm Beach County, the Honorable Mayor Felder. 407 City Council, City Manager, employees, friends and family come to acknowledge the 408 memory of Terrance Denard Holland. 409 WHEREAS, Terrance Denard Holland was born to the parents of Isaac and Freida 410 Holland on December 6, 1985; and 411 WHEREAS, he was educated in the School District of Palm Beach County and 412 graduated in 2006 from William T. Dwyer High School in Palm Beach Gardens. He later 413 graduated 2008 from Lincoln College for technology, in West Palm Beach; and 414 WHEREAS, Terrance was a family oriented, loving father of three children, brother 415 to a dozen siblings; and 416 WHEREAS, Terrance was a lifelong resident of the City of Riviera Beach, wherein 417 he served as a valued and outstanding City employee who began his employment with 418 the City in 2007, transitioning to several departments, including the Marina, Parks & 419 Recreation, and customer service for the Utility District building; and 420 WHEREAS, on October 12, 2013, he began working alternately in the City Utility 421 Special District as a water and sewer maintenance worker, with their easement crew. - 459 SHIRLEY LANIER, COUNCILWOMAN, 561-845-3687
- 460 **Chairperson Lanier:** The next Item on the Agenda is No. 4, which is the
- 461 Proclamation from the Office of the Mayor, City of Riviera Beach, Palm Beach County,
- declaring the month of April as Reentry Month. And I have this... And are there any
- gentlemen from the reentry that are here? [Pause]. Okay. I'm gonna come over here
- 464 and read this...
- 465 [Inaudible dais comments and chuckles]
- 466 **Chairperson Lanier:** Alright. Let's stand back a little bit 'cause I'm gonna take my
- 467 mask off. Alright. This is a Proclamation for the, the month of April, which is Reentry
- 468 Month. As you know, the City of Riviera Beach has a reentry program that works with
- returning citizens to our City.

WHEREAS, more than six hundred thousand men and women leave American prisons every year. More than eleven million people annually cycle through our nation's jails. National recidivism rates top fifty percent, and thousands of adults and juveniles return from incarceration to Palm Beach County each year; and

WHEREAS, it costs \$18,000 per year to house an adult inmate at the state level, \$48, 910 per year at the local level, and \$50,000 per year to house a juvenile; and

WHEREAS, the work has been done by the county's Reentry Task Force, and the Riviera Beach Reentry Center plays an integral role in the county's collaborative efforts that has made Palm Beach County a national leader in reentry services; and

WHEREAS, the citizens returning to Riviera Beach and Palm Beach County have benefitted from the important work of the community partners who have cut recidivism rates in half and provided returning citizens unprecedented access to job training, healthcare, housing, case management, and have put thousands of individuals on a path to productive, successful lives; and

WHEREAS, the demand for reentry services remains high, and the investments we make today will pay dividends for returning citizens and Public Safety in Riviera Beach.

NOW THEREFORE, I, Ronnie Felder, Mayor of the City of Riviera Beach in Palm Beach County, by the power vested in me by the residents of Riviera Beach, do hereby proclaim the month of April as Reentry Month in Riviera Beach and implore all citizens to be aware that encouraging the restoration and the reintegration of persons who have paid their debt to society, who have paid their debt to society, and ultimately makes communities safer and saves taxpayer dollars by lowering the direct and collateral cost of incarceration.

I HAVE HEREUNTO set my hand and caused the official sela of the City of Riviera Beach on this 7th day of April 2021.

And that is our reentry program. And I want.., I encourage all of our businesses in the City to be involved in our reentry program. It is an excellent program. It is something that this City needs. It is something that returning citizens need. And as this Proclamation says, and I will say it again, they have paid their debt to society, and now it is time for them to move on with their lives and for them to have the support that they need.

Reentry Center Director Bullard: Thank you Council Chair Lanier. And also, thank you to the Board for being so supportive of our, of our reentry program here for over the past fourteen years.

And so, Reentry Month is this month, for the month of April. And also, for the county it's Second Chance Month. So there's a myriad of activities that are planned throughout the month. We'll be hosting our event on Tuesday, this Tuesday at 6:00 o'clock, right here, our Reentry Awareness Night. So, everyone is invited to come out. Council Chair Lanier will be one of our panelists, along with Commissioner Mack [stammer] Bernard and a few other reentry advocates.

So, we're just excited about all the things that we have in store for our community, and these men and women that are returning from incarceration. And so, we have access to social support services, housing, substance abuse, education. A lot of different things that are there. And so, we'll be using the month of April to highlight all, all of the things that we have going on throughout this month.

And if I can take just about five seconds to introduce some of my Staff, is here. If we can have our reentry team, anyone from our reentry team to stand up.

- So, once again, we just wanna say thank you to the Board, Council Lanier, Honorable and City Manager for your unparalleled support of our program throughout the

- So, but we can definitely get with them on
- 549 Tuesday.
- 550 **Councilperson Botel**: Great.
- 551 **Reentry Center Director Bullard:** And try to get that, that list updated.
- 552 **Councilperson Botel:** And, and there's an event on the 17th at St. James. Desmond
- Meade is gonna be there with the Florida Rights Restoration Coalition van and everything.
- So, I just wanted people to be aware of that.
- 555 **Reentry Center Director Bullard:** Definitely, definitely.
- 556 **Councilperson Botel:** Thanks.

- 589 RODNEY FREEMAN, LIBRARY DIRECTOR, 561-845-4195
- 590 **Chairperson Lanier:** Our next Item on the Agenda, is the presentation of
- Reimagine City of Riviera Beach. And, I would like to introduce you guys to the new 591
- 592 Library Director, Mr. Rodney Freeman. But, Mr. Evans...
- 593 Yes. Madam Chair and Members of the Board, we're excited City Manager Evans:
- 594 to provide some additional information with regards to the Reimagine Riviera Beach and
- 595 the progress that we're making on the site that was acquired aby the City, 2129 North
- 596 Congress Avenue and what is happening in that particular space.

- Later on this evening, you will have an Item that will assist in appropriating some additional monies to effectuate the vision that you will see tonight.
- So, without further ado, you're gonna hear from our Library Director, Mr. Rodney Freeman.
- 601 **Library Director Freeman:** Hello. And...
- 602 **Chairperson Lanier:** Welcome, Mr. Freeman.
- 603 **Library Director Freeman:** ...waiting for the [inaudible] to pull up.
- 604 **City Clerk Anthony:** Media team, do you all have the, the presentation?
- 605 **Media Team:** [Inaudible].
- 606 **Chairperson Lanier:** Yeah. It's on Novus.
- 607 **Media Team:** [Inaudible].
- 608 **Library Director Freeman:** No? We sent in...
- 609 Chairperson Lanier: It's on Novus.
- 610 **Library Director Freeman:** We sent them in?
- 611 **Chairperson Lanier:** It's, it's on the link, Walter, for the Agenda. While he's finding
- that presentation, could you tell us something about yourself, Mr. Freeman, so you can...
- to the public? I know you've come up here before, but we very rarely see you and we're
- so happy to see you again, in terms of our new Library. So, give us something, give us
- something.
- 616 **Library Director Freeman:** Sure, sure.
- 617 [Chuckles]
- 618 Library Director Freeman: So, my library experiences has.., I started off as a
- 619 page. And, I actually have risen up to become a Library Director. I started as a page, I
- became a librarian working with electronic resources, working with digit projects. That
- was my focus when I went to school for my master's in Library Science. I also have a
- 622 master's degree in Public Administration. I became a branch manager with St. Louis
- Public Library, Indianapolis Public Library. And then, in Chicago, I because the Library
- 624 Director for the Woodson Regional Library, which is on the southside. We had, we had
- the Harsh collection. If you guys are familiar with the Schomburg..., the Harsh Collection,
- is the second largest African American collection outside of that. So, I managed that.
- And then, I went and was promoted to the Harold Washington Library, where I
- managed two hundred people, six different departments. And, from there, I became an
- assistant professor in.., at Tennessee State. And now I'm here.

- So, that's the full extent of my library experience.
- 631 **Chairperson Lanier:** Well, very good. Very good, sir. Are we ready, Mr... Oh,
- he's, he's still getting it. Tell us about this..., what, what, do you wanna do for the City's
- 633 Library collections? I, I'm not sure what collections we have.
- 634 **Library Director Freeman:** Sure.
- 635 **Chairperson Lanier:** I'm not sure what your direction is for that, how you see the
- 636 City in terms of this whole new digital opening for, for us.
- 637 **Library Director Freeman:** Yeah. So, let me, let me just take a little nuance to
- that. So basically, we actually, right now, we're in the building. We're.., I, I know it doesn't
- seem.., we're not visible like we used to be, but we actually are. We have three satellite
- locations, we're at the Brooks Center, we're at the Ambassador Center, and then we're
- at Lindsey Davis Center on Monday, Wednesdays and Fridays. So, the days that we're
- not there on Monday, Wednesdays or Fridays, we're actually in the building weeding
- material, and then discarding some of the older books.
- But, we're also working on special projects. We have our archives that we're do'.., that we're getting ready to inventory so we can digitize the newspapers that we have in
- our archives so it could be more accessible to the public.
- So, with, with this new temporary location, even though our archives room will be
- really small, it's gonna actually.., you'll actually be able to access our archives through
- online. And so, that's one of the projects that we're working on right now.
- 650 **Chairperson Lanier:** Excellent. Very good. I think that we're ready. Mr. Walter?
- 651 **Media Team:** [Inaudible].
- 652 **Chairperson Lanier:** Alright. Very good.
- 653 **Library Director Freeman:** Alright. So, I would like to present to you the layout
- of the Library/Youth Empowerment Building. And if you see... if you pull up the next slide.
- you'll see the actual layout of the whole building.
- 656 **Media Team:** [Inaudible].
- 657 **City Manager Evans:** Do you have any good jokes?
- 658 [Chuckles]
- 659 **City Manager Evans:** Or any unique hobbies?
- 660 **Library Director Freeman:** [Chuckle. No. I, I... I was not prepared for jokes.
- 661 [Chuckles]

- 662 **Media Team:** [Inaudible].
- 663 **Chairperson Lanier:** Okay. Alright. Very good. So, since that's not going to work
- and you wanted to show us something visually, give us something so we...
- 665 Library Director Freeman: So...
- 666 **Chairperson Lanier:** ... can come back later in the, in the program and, and pick up
- with this. But, but gives us something.
- 668 **Library Director Freeman:** I can give you a overview. So...
- 669 Chairperson Lanier: Yes.
- 670 **Library Director Freeman:** An overview of the, the building where we have
- the Youth Empowerment Program and the Library, we have a main Library that's.., once
- you see the actual layout, which is in the south.., southwest corner, and the Children's
- 673 Library, which is in the northeast corner. That being said, we also.., when you work..,
- walk into the Library, you'll be able to see the Library as soon as you walk into the door.
- You'll be able t.., once you get into the main Library, you'll be able to see that we've
- blended this traditional and modern ble'.., types of libraries, which is.., we'll have a public
- meeting room, we'll also have a African American room/archives room. We'll definitely
- have a business center/entrepreneurship center in the Library. And then also, a public
- pc in the Library, in the main Library area.

Now, in the children's area, what we've done is we went ahead and we kinda encourage play in the Library, but we've also encouraged our young readers to really be able to, to grab those books. So, we have.., the books are actually facing outward so they can actually see the covers. And in the children's rea, we're gonna be doing our story time and we actually are also partnering with the African American Research Library to have some teams come in to digitize some of their, their history and we can share that with the public as well.

- So, so that's what you'll see in the, in the Library.
- 688 Chairperson Lanier: Alright. Well, thank you so much, Mr...
- 689 **Library Director Freeman:** And, and we have...
- 690 **Chairperson Lanier:** Oh, we have it.
- 691 **Library Director Freeman**: We have it

- 695 building layout. And, if...

- 698 Chairperson Lanier: Okay.
- 699 **Library Director Freeman:** And so, I know you probably cannot see, but the, the,
- the, the two areas that are highlighted in color, those are the main areas that the Library
- 701 will be operating out of. The main Library, again, in the southwest corner, and the
- 702 Children's Library in the northeast corner. The next slide please.

So, once you walk into the door, you, your, your attention is gonna be grabbed. You'll see two self-checkout machines. You'll see that we'll have our collection out so people can be able to enjoy the co'.., the coffee and something to eat from the café that will be managed by the Youth Empowerment Program. Next slide, please.

And in this slide, you actually see where we blended the traditional and the modern look of a library. It's more inviting and encourages you to stay and kinda sit and enjoy the Library. So, one of the things that you don't see on this slide, is our African American/archives room, which is gonna be more of a, a quiet space for people who want to just sit and, and work. And then also to be able to pull up our digital archives. The next slide, please.

And this is our children's rea. We have a study room for the children's.., and then we, again, like I said, encouraging play, but also just to, to engage the young reader to come in and grab a book and sit and, and stay a while.

- And that's the, the main Library areas.

- our partner, came up with Youth Empowerment.
- About sixteen years ago, because of the crime that we were having in our county, and just in the State of Florida, kicked off an initiative with the Florida State team,
- and just in the State of Florida, kicked off an initiative with the Florida State team, criminology department, to actually check out how we were assessing the, the crimes that
- were going on in our neighborhoods. Riviera Beach was one of five Youth
- Empowerments that actually was spinned off to actually work with students that are
- 777 eleven to nineteen. But since the...
- 778 [Inaudible comment]
- 779 Youth Empowerment Program Director Grimsley: ...incep'... I'm sorry? Oh. Since
- the inception of that, we've [stammer] expanded the concept. We've heard the cry of our
- community. We've expanded our services to now do holistic services to our families.
- And, with tat, Mr. Evans, the Council and the community really wanted to give us
- a larger space to actually provide those services. So, with that, we've expanded not only
- our partnership with the county, who is here, but we've also expanded our partnership
- with Florida..., Florida Atlantic University community, and adult education with Palm Beach
- 786 County. We've also expanded our partnership in some other sectors as well to provide
- 787 more of a holistic service to our community.
- So, with that, we have expanded to rebranding Youth Empowerment. We will
- continue to always be Youth Empowerment, and we are going to continue to use that

name. But, we have to look further ahead so that we can be more inclusive than exclusive with our adults that we serve now. We are aligning ourselves with the county Master Plan, which serves birth to twenty-two. And, we really want to do that in a holistic manner. So, we are changing our name to The Emerging Community Center. It will be an overarching name. And Youth Empowerment will still be our underlying name, so we will use both of those names.

We will change our services. And, with moving with the Library, it's going to afford us an opportunity to now have a STEM lab with our partnership with Florida Atlantic University, being with the professor in one of the main hubs in our STEM lab. We are looking to expand some of our services so that we can also, on PDD days, offer science and biology training to some of our Palm Beach County science teachers.

We, in addition, we have saw the need that sending some of our students that participate in our GED program, sending them outside of our community is somewhat of a injustice to them. They come back disgruntled, they come back frustrated if they don't pass the test when we provided the [stammer] preparation for them. So, what we've decided to do in our new facility, is also become a Pearson VUE testing center. It will be certified, where our people now, and other, other community citizens from around our surrounding areas, will also be able to take their GED test onsite now, in the Library. In addition to that, some of the Microsoft Office [stammer] certifications will be provided as well. So, we will have our own certified testing lab within the Library.

We will also kickoff our virtual reality room. So, our students will not only be playing the PlayStations and the Xbox, they will be able to experience Mars without leaving Riviera Beach. So, that's one of our biggest things.

In addition, we are talk'.., in talks with some, some other funders and some other people, that I won't mention today, but something Mrs. McBride and I are working on to utilize our testing center, as well as our [stammer].., our.., it's going to be a nice, nice... If we can get the pictures, a nice, nice room where we can have a classroom, where we can offer some training to get our people back to work.

And those are just some of the innovative things. But the biggest innovation that we have is, in the Riviera Beach Library Community Center and Youth Empowerment, we'll have our own café. When you enter the Library, there will be a cafe, somewhat of a micro-Starbucks or a micro Chi'..., Chick Fil-A where you'll be able to receive coffee, donuts, croissants, and be able to enjoy the surroundings while you have your coffee in the morning, or while you enjoy our Library, you'll be able to also visit our café. Which will be ran by the City and the Youth Empowerment.

Chairperson Lanier: Madam Chair? I mean, I'm sorry. [Chuckle]. Mr. Lawson.

- Ms. Grimsley, first, I just wanna thank you for the efforts and energy with the Youth Empowerment Program. You've done an amazing job with it, even though the pandemic and moving forward. So, thank you very much.
- Youth Empowerment Program Director Grimsley: [Inaudible].
- 833 **Councilperson Lawson:** Can you tell us a little bit about the testing center?
- Youth Empowerment Program Director Grimsley: Yes.

The testing center is.., will be certified. So, if you can imagine our students going to our RCA Boulevard to take some of the, not only the GED, but to either take their fireman test or take their Microsoft Office certifications, they have to go into a certified lad in order to take those tests. And they have to be observed by a tester. So, we're going to have that ability to do that. And it's a revenue generator for us as well. Those tests are thirty-two dollars apiece, and it's four tests for the GED. So those dollars will come back into Riviera Beach.

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- Councilperson Lawson: And where are some of the nearest testing sites? 'Cause I understand that they're in Boca. They're kinda far for our residents, and for local.
- Youth Empowerment Program Director Grimsley: There's only three in the county right now.
- 847 **Councilperson Lawson:** Mhmm.
- Youth Empowerment Program Director Grimsley: That is Palm Beach Gardens,
- 849 Belle Glade and Delray.
- 850 Councilperson Lawson: Okay.
- Youth Empowerment Program Director Grimsley: So, we'll be centrally lo'..., centrally
- in, you know, where... we'll be centrally accessible to residents that can't get on the bus
- or may not be able to go that far because of maybe children or other issues that may
- preclude them from getting...
- 855 Councilperson Lawson: Yeah.
- Youth Empowerment Program Director Grimsley: ...there.
- 857 **Councilperson Lawson:** Again, thank you for your efforts. Excellent job.
- 858 Youth Empowerment Program Director Grimsley: Mhmm.
- 859 **Chairperson Lanier:** Are there any other questions for Mrs. Grimsley?
- 860 **City Manager Evans:** I think we have the...

861 Chairperson Lanier: Oh, we got it.

talking about as far as contractual.

- 862 **City Manager Evans:** So, we can, we can show the pretty pictures.
- Youth Empowerment Program Director Grimsley: [Chuckle].
- 864 **Chairperson Lanier:** Alright. Very good. Mrs. Grimsley.
- 865 Youth Empowerment Program Director Grimsley: As you can see, this, this is the front of the Library, or in front of the Library/Youth Empowerment Community Center. 866 When you enter, if you can go to the next slide. [Pause]. This is where you'll be entering 867 our Library. [Pause]. If you can go to the next slide. Okay. This one is our café. So, 868 869 this is what you would be entering into. This would be, when you walk through the main 870 doors, this will be to your right. As Mr. Freeman showed you, the seating areas and the 871 books will be to your left, this will be to your right. You'd be able to enter our café, receive 872 your coffee and even, if we work this the right way, you'd be even able to purchase your... 873 a, a bag of coffee to take with you. We are in talks with a couple different coffee vendors 874 that we will be presenting to our Legal team, to review some of the things that they're

What you're seeing is our virtual reality room. So, the two televisions that you see in front of you will actually be your virtual reality, where they.., the students will put on goggles in order to leave Riviera Beach while still being in Riviera Beach. In order to meet the need of everyone, you see the three televisions to the right of the wall, our students will continue to be able to play their Xbox and their PlayStations. So, it will be more inclusive, while also looking to the future.

- 882 **City Manager Evans:** And part of the virtual reality is gonna incorporate a Riviera 883 Beach City Council meeting experience as well.
- 884 [Chuckle]

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- Youth Empowerment Program Director Grimsley: This is our actual training room/classroom, so it will actually be used both ways. [Pause]. And this will be our training room. But students will also be able to use this as a classroom. Mr. Freeman will be able to provide trainings as well for the Library, so it will have multi uses. It will also have the surround sound so there will be.., it will be used for virtually anything that you wanna use for the Library.
 - We are equipping this room with chairs that are.., they are nesting chairs and tables. So, if we need to con'.., you know, reduce the tables to actually add some more square footage, you'll be able to do that as well.

What you're seeing now is our testing center. [Pause]. Which will have somewhat of this concept. As you may, may be aware, in the testing center it's all online, so you have to provide some coverage so, you know, it.., that it remains trans'.., transparent at all times.

What we didn't talk about is our STEM lab. We talked about it just a little bit, but there's a two component to our STEM lab. This is our first component to the STEM lab, which is where we have the partnership with Florida Atlantic. This is what our STEM will mirror.

Our second component is the inside and outside Hydroponic Gardening Program. This will be our inside hydroponic area to your left-hand side, and somewhat of a mirror of what the outside hydroponic area will be. Our thought process with this is to take the plants that..., and the vegetables that we're growing and actually place them back into our café, to actually either provide them to the public or send home with some of the students and the citizens from the Library and Youth Empowerment.

And our last thing is this, in order to grow to be a strong tree, we must first treat the root. We have to serve our citizens as a whole. As we can't keep serving our kids and not serving our families.

930 Mr. Evans or Ms. Grimsley, will the expansion of our YEP Program have any effects on our grant funding that we're receiving from the county?

- Youth Empowerment Program Director Grimsley: I'm sorry. Say that one more time.
- **Councilperson Lawson:** Will this expansion, or changes of our name or development of our program, have any effects on the grant funding we receive from the county?
- 935 Youth Empowerment Program Director Grimsley: It will not. We will continue to use
- Youth Empowerment's name, as we've always have. And, our partnership.., and Mr. Ike
- 937 Powell is here now, to speak to that. But, we will continue to use their name and the
- concepts. The concepts work. We have the statistics to actually measure that by. The,
- 939 the concepts work. We're not going to change that. We're just expanding it so we can
- 940 serve our citizens as a whole, and to bring some of those concepts into the adult
- population. But Mr. Ike Powell can speak closer to that for you.
- **Councilperson Lawson:** Please. Thank you.

- **Mr. I. Powell:** Good evening, Madam Chair. Good evening to the entire Council.
- Good evening, Mayor Felder, and also good evening, Ms. Wynn and Mr. Evans.

Thank you for the opportunity to speak on behalf of Palm Beach County Youth Services. I'm a member of that team. And we work extremely close with Val. And the first thing I wanna say, when she approached us with this, we had nothing but great things to say. My words were, 'Wow.' I was totally impressed with her vision, and she's always been a visionary.

As many of you know, Youth Empowerment Centers in Palm Beach County have been around for more than fifteen years. They were birthed with funding that the county committed to a larger vision of overall youth violence prevention throughout the county. As she mentioned, there were five Youth Empowerment Centers, and they were birthed with the intention of the county starting them off and then assisting the cities with maintaining them.

The county continues to maintain five of the Youth Empowerment Centers, Riviera Beach, Belle Glade and then one down in Lake Worth. We're so proud of the work that they do. I'm extremely proud of the work that Valerie does, her vision for everything and where she's taking the Youth Empowerment Center here in Riviera Beach. It is the largest of the Riv'..., the three Youth Empowerment Centers. The concept, she's always very transparent with anything she's looking to do. We are, as you know, a very significant funder. We just executed another three-year agreement back in October.

The Youth Empowerment Center, so you all realize, it comes from a separate pool of funding that we have within the Youth Services. So, that funding is dedicated specifically to Youth Empowerment Centers. Our overall intention is to continue to fund those Youth Empowerment Centers as long as we can.

Our partnership with the City, and specifically with Valerie is, as I said, is extreme. She approached us with this. She's offered us the opportunity to take a walkthrough before the work even started in the building, and I thank her wholeheartedly for that. She showed us all these pictures, we talk about the branding. We are.., we were concerned about potential impacts with branding the name, but we came to the conclusion that her vision is excellent, The Emerging Community Center. So, being able to still brand a Youth Empowerment Center on flyers and all the collateral, on the outreach to the young people of Palm Beach County is, is very important, and being able to weave that Youth Empowerment Center into the overall concept of the Emerging Community Center.

We love the fact that she's expanding it, serving a more holistic family approach to the community. We've talked to her to ensure that she understands the necessity to still adheres to the contract, 'cause I'm in a role, me and my team of overall compliance to ensure that the county's funds are spent on the population that's in that contract, the eleven and nineteen years old, on a specific services and activities to achieve the outcomes. And she does a great job of doing it. I'm very confident that she will continue to do that under this new branding.

What we didn't show you pictures of, because we don't have the imagery just yet is, when you enter the Library, once you pass the, the café, you'll be able to experience a saltwater fish tank. That will teach our students and citizens about, not only about the

- ecosystem, but also about our waterways, what's in the waters, how some of the coral is becoming extinct, how we need to appreciate them.
- Initially, we're gonna start off with a freshwater tank. I don't know if Mr. Evans wants me to divulge what's in the freshwater tank?
- 1004 City Manager Evans: Sure.
- 1005 Youth Empowerment Program Director Grimsley: Okay. So, initially, we're gonna
- start off with a freshwater tank to really drill down and teach our students and our families
- about the ecosystem on the freshwater side. And, we are formulating a partnership...
- when I say we, Mr. Bailey and myself is working with a few con'.., contractors and
- vendors. Your.., we'll be able to bring in baby alligators and use it as a technique of
- teaching our children, not only safety, but also some of the dangers that's in our waters.
- 1011 We're gonna work with the vendor because they have the expertise. They.., the baby
- alligator only stays small for so long, so we're gonna use that as a teachable moment.
- 1013 [Chuckle]
- 1014 Youth Empowerment Program Director Grimsley: And then, bring in our saltwater
- tank to actually expand that teaching around our waterways.
- 1016 Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson: Mm. Nice.
- 1017 Councilperson Lawson: Wow.
- 1018 Chairperson Lanier: Very good.
- 1019 Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson: Madam Chair?

So, what I was going to talk about tonight, but still wanna proceed with those thoughts and those conversations, is back to our infrastructure. That's always my subject matter, being a long-term citizen on Singer Island. Infrastructure, the traffic situation, hurricane evacuations, the excessive speed, the danger. No one obeys the speed limit coming up and down the bridge. No one obeys the speed limit coming around North Ocean. And I know our police are very busy, but it's very dangerous. So, our infrastructure, our roads, the speed limits, concerns about being able to evacuate. And, the infrastructure with our drainage, the high tides, our construction. Back to the hurricanes, is everything on track for all these big condos to be able to shut down their cranes, shutdown their building materials so those things are safe and secure?

And also, with that being said, it's also sea turtle nesting season, so I'm hoping that all of the condos already in construction, or under construction, are all in compliance with their lighting so they're not affecting our sea turtles.

But, as the previous presentations were talking about, we have a gem. Our cultural resources, our environ'.., our environmental resources, we are so blessed.

- 1157 **City Clerk Anthony:** Lloyd Brown, Margaret Shepherd.
- 1158 **Mr. L. Brown:** How ya doin'? My name is Lloyd Brown. [Chuckle]. I guess you
- already know that.
- But, I'm up here because, you know, I think.., my friend, she always talking about
- I complain, you know, about things, but, like, when it comes to the City, I, I, I don't

understand what she's saying so I don't really... But she builds me up so when I get over here, I can complain and, you know, I don't really worry about what you people think but I have to worry about her.

But anyway, you know, you ever heard of the Trojan Horse? That's the horse that they brought in and, you know, and the people thought it was gonna be such a great deal. Well now, in Riviera Beach, we got trojan houses. They're bringing 'em in and you understand, like, they'll tell you it's gonna be a house where you're gonna have housing or whatever, then the next thing you know, in the next two months, they got a group home there. And the people that live next door don't know anything about it. And, nobody says anything to them.

And okay, like, as far as these lots I see being cleaned too, I see a lotta Spanish guys cleaning 'em. And, even the houses that they're rental, there's more rentals in Riviera Beach, I think, than there are in the United States. Honestly. I'm gonna tell you the truth. 'Cause all these houses over here, most of them are rental houses. And what's so bad about that is, okay, in a rental house, you don't have a washer and a dryer for a woman that has kids, and you let these people lease these houses through the Health Department to these people.

And, I mean, okay, all you need with some of these women, they don't even cook. You need a microwave, a washer rand a dryer. 'Cause, I'mma tell you like this, most of them don't cook. But when you go to the store, all they get is soup in a cup and stuff like that. And they have to go to these corner stores to actually buy most of the food that they get. But, when you eat food and you go to school, your clothes get dirty, and you definitely have to go the restroom. When things get dirty, your clothes, without a washer and a dryer, I mean, that doesn't even make sense. But you'll.., they have to get in these houses, so they have to take the deal that they get.

And, I mean, I don't see you all lettin' these people come in here and rent these house. I done' seen some slumlords. I know a house in Riviera Beach that's only got one door. But there's about twelve kids that be in there. It only has one door. So where your..., where' the Code Enforcement? Oh, the Code Enforcement over there with my friend on 6th Street, telling him that he need' to get his address so they can see it. But they don't go to these rental houses. I, I look at the rental houses... When a person leave a rental house, if they go in there and they gotta tear damn near everything out to repair it, don't you know that house has been that way for the longest? It just did not happen?

'Cause I live next door to a rental house, and these people complain to me. Most people that come and complain to me, , they talk about all ya'll. And I'm not gonna tell you what they're saying but they're just, like, disgruntled. You know? Almost like a disgruntled employee. These are disgruntled citizens. I mean, you need to look at these rental houses instead of messing with somebody about the, the door doesn't have the address on it. Or, your yard grass is brown, when you got a rental house...

- 1203 **Mr. L. Brown:** ...where these people make twelve hundred dollars a month. They
- should have the greenest grass.
- 1205 **Chairperson Lanier:** Thank you, Mr. Brown.
- 1206 City Clerk Anthony: Margaret Shepherd.
- 1207 **Ms. M. Shepherd:** Margaret Shepherd, Riviera Beach.
- That was a tough situation coming behind Mr. Brown. I tell ya, I admire him. I admire him.
- 1210 But, I'm here today.., I was listening to him say people complain. And I think it was 1211 Monday when we had the senior citizen luncheon over at Lindsey Davis. I didn't go 'cause 1212 I wasn't feeling well. And I had a call, and they said, 'Ms. Shepherd, where are you?' I said, 'I'm at home.' And they said, 'Can we come over and talk to you?' And I said, 'We?' 1213 I said, 'How many is we?' They said eight. I said, 'Okay. I can accommodate that into 1214 1215 my little room.' The complaint was the treatment of Mr. Lawson. I'm just delivering a message you all. And I asked them what was the complaint? They said, 'Well, he's 1216 1217 everywhere. Wherever we go, he's there, he dance, he laugh and just have a good time 1218 with us.' And they said they were just disturbed by him not getting the Chair.
- And so, I tried to explain to them that, even though your Pro Tem Char, it does not mean you will become Chair. It's the vote between them. So, they're just distraught and a couple of them said they weren't voting, they didn't vote the last time. And I said, 'Well, I'm gonna say it on Channel 18.'
- Mr. Lawson, I, I just want you to be encouraged that they're still your seniors, and I hope you don't go anywhere. I hope you don't get discouraged. I hope you still love 'em and kiss them and take all them pictures with them because that's what they like. And I thank you. And I thank the ones that came over to talk to me. And I want you to know, you know, we have to do a little bit better. Even if we don't like you, we still have to be a little bit better. I'm just the messenger now. Don't get upset with me.

- 1231 City Clerk Anthony: Madam Chair, Members of the Board, that concludes public
- comments that were submitted before the calling of the.., no longer accepting cards.
- 1233 **Chairperson Lanier:** Alright. Thank you.
- 1234 7. THIRTY-MINUTES PRESENTATION UPDATE BY ALPHA EDUCATIONAL
- 1235 **FOUNDATION, INC.**
- 1236 **Chairperson Lanier:** The next Item on the Agenda is a thirty-minute presentation.
- 1237 Mr. Evans.

- 1238 **City Manager Evans:** Madam Chair and Members of the Board, if I can have the
- Deputy City Manager, Ms. Elizabeth McBride, make this presentation. And she will also
- be making this presentation in collaboration with the Alpha Foundation Fraternity.
- 1241 City Clerk Anthony: Madam Chair, Members of the Board, we do have public
- 1242 comment on this Item. The acceptance of public comment on this Item is now closed.
- 1243 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Good evening, Madam Chair...
- 1244 **Chairperson Lanier:** Good evening.
- 1245 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** ...and the rest of the Council, Mayor, and City
- Manager.
- Tonight, we were hoping to provide you with a two-part presentation. First, an
- 1248 update from the January meeting, when we first dealt with the issue surrounding the
- Lease with the Alpha Educational Foundation. And second, the fraternity has requested
- 1250 [stammer] to do a short presentation about the organization.
- During the January meeting, there were several issues that were identified, that
- were delinquent relative to the Lease.
- 1253 **Chairperson Lanier:** Madam... I'm sorry. Ms. McBride...
- 1254 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Yes.
- 1255 **Chairperson Lanier:** The gentleman standing... We have seating in the, in the..,
- here. And if there's not a seat, that means that that's overflow. So, you have to have a
- seat because we have to be..., maintain our six feet distance in this auditorium. So, if you
- can come and have a seat. And if there are no seats, then that means that you have to
- go to the overflow. [Pause]. If there are no seats, that means that you have to go to the
- overflow. [Pause]. Okay. Very good. Mrs. McBride.
- 1261 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** For the first part, providing with a status update
- regarding the Lese. Since the last meeting, we, City Staff, has... we've had three
- meetings with the members of the Alpha Educational Foundation to discuss the Lease,
- the terms of the Lese, and to address deficiencies related to the Lease.

1265 At the January meeting, it was reported to you that they were delinquent as to rent 1266 and late fees. They are no longer delinquent in that area. The rental fees have been paid

1267 up to September of 2021. Also, it was stated that they were delinquent in their Solid

- 1267 up to September of 2021. Also, it was stated that they were delinquent in their Solid 1268 Waste assessment fees. It was determined that, after much go 'round, in exchange, that
- the Alphas did not have dumpsters on their site, as they were being assessed for, but
- roller containers. And we've just been able to provide them, this afternoon, with the
- statement as to the four-year cost for those containers. So, that is something that will
- have to be addressed later because there is a question as to what date the charges
- should start to be accumulating.

The other area related to.., of great importance to the City, were the insurance requirements. All the Alphas, as well as all the tenants, have met the insurance requirements associated with the Lease. All.., with only one tenant who apparently they're auto insurance provision, we found out this afternoon, had lapsed. The tenant does have the commercial general liability, but it's the auto part that has lapsed.

For the business licensing, Ms. Wynn is in the process of reviewing the subleases of the tenants. Once those are completed, they will be able to pr'.., submit their applications [inaudible] four applications already, the Alphas for their leasing part, one for.., also, another one for their mentoring and tutoring program. And, for the subtenants, we do have also two applications presently pending, Florida Fishing Academy and Acts of Kindness. And the only.., what is it, only Barrier, it's just the approval and signoff on the subleases by the City.

Several building inspections have been made of the site by the Building Official, who has indicted he is happy with the progress that has been made, that a lotta work has been done at the site, even though there is still a lot of work that needs to be done if you.., relative to the site. And, for the next month, up until, like, June or July, he will provide monthly reports of the progress with the building violations and their corrections. And, the Manager will provide you with the, the outcome of those inspections.

Okay. If you have any questions regarding any of the issues that were stated in January, we do have the Risk Manager here. We have the Building Official here. We have Mr. Sherman here, with the finances. If you have any further questions. Otherwise, for the Alphas, I think the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity is here, and their Men oof Tomorrow group is here. And the presenters on their behalf will be Dr. George Lockhart, Mr. Alfred Fields, who manages the Educational Foundation part, and Mr. Finley. Okay.

- **Chairperson Lanier:** Okay. You can come forward.
- 1299 Councilperson McCoy: Madam Chair?
- 1300 Chairperson Lanier: Yes, sir.
- **Councilperson McCoy:** So, Ms... Before he does...
- 1302 Chairperson Lanier: Yes?
- 1303 Councilperson McCoy: So, what exactly was the thirty minutes? Is that the entire
- presentation? Is it a presentation of thirty minutes from the Alphas? What.., explain this.
- Because, Ms. McBride started off by saying there will be two sections, so I wanna ask
- them guestions of what Ms. McBride said, but I wanna know what the rules of engagement
- 1307 are.

- 1308 Chairperson Lanier: Yes. Ms. McBride.
- Deputy City Manager McBride: The Alphas asked the Manager if they could do a presentation, for tonight, about their organization. And, as part of it, if you remember...

- recall, the questions that were raised by Members of the Council, it was asked for them
- to present an update of the programs currently at the site, and how they are benefitting
- the City, and any physical improvements that they would be making to the [inaudible]...
- 1314 **Chairperson Lanier:** I think the question is, how long does this take?
- Deputy City Manager McBride: Oh. The video that Mr... It's about seven minutes, the
- 1316 one I...
- 1317 Chairperson Lanier: Right.
- 1318 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** ...saw. Okay.
- 1319 Chairperson Lanier: Mr. McCoy.
- 1320 Councilperson McCoy: Follow up.
- 1321 Chairperson Lanier: Yes.
- 1322 **Councilperson McCoy:** So, before we get into that, I wanna address the issues that
- prompted us to go and ask these questions. I know, then Councilperson Lanier, who's
- 1324 Chair, had shared some of the same concerns. And, Mr. Evans, please help me out
- because I just so happened to be at the meeting March 21, 2018, and I went back and
- reviewed the video and I have the transcript in front of me, so I wanna make sure that I
- can get down to my concerns about the noncompliance before we hear about any
- program or progress that they've done.
- So, I wanna start off. And I know we got an update, but I wanna make sure that
- we get some clarification. And, and I want the Members' attention on this because when
- we brought this up in January, I specifically asked to have, I think a head of the meeting,
- 1332 Ms. Wynn, I think I asked for an ledger to find out where they were, ahead of them coming
- before us. And then, we got in the meeting in January, it was stated that the payments
- were sent into the City and they mailed in, or something of that sort, but they were lost.
- And it was never credited to account. And I wanna first resolve those issues before we
- go into talking about some of the other programming and progress things.
- So, can we discuss the, you know, when this was brought current and how many
- months delinquent at that point, before it was brought current?
- Deputy City Manager McBride: It was brought current after our meeting in January.
- 1340 Councilperson McCoy: Okay.
- 1341 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Okay.
- 1342 **Councilperson McCoy:** So, by my just rough estimate, because this first...
- Deputy City Manager McBride: That was for the entire.., since March 2018.

- 1344 **Councilperson McCoy:** So, I count that to be thirty-four months of being delinquent.
- Deputy City Manager McBride: Thirty-four. Thirty-four, thirty-three.
- 1346 **Councilperson McCoy:** Would Mr. Sherman be able to attest to that?
- 1347 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Maybe.
- 1348 Councilperson McCoy: And Ms. Wynn, I'm coming to you regarding the Lease...,
- sublease agreements as well.
- 1350 **City Attorney Wynn:** Yes, sir.
- 1351 Finance and Administrative Services Director Sherman: Good, good evening,
- 1352 Mayor and Council. Randy Sherman, Finance Director.
- Yes, at that point, they were thirty-four months delinquent.
- 1354 **Councilperson McCoy:** So, at that point, did you create, in your internal financial
- accounting system, an account solely for the Alpha Education Foundation once we did
- get them account.., get the payment that brought them current?
- 1357 Finance and Administrative Services Director Sherman: We, we generated invoices
- for the past due amounts, plus the late fees that are provided for in the Lease Agreement.
- And then, we had previously mailed out the Solid Waste assessments. That comes in, in
- November. So that, that had previously been mailed. But, as far as the rents, we provided
- them with the invoices. And again, those were paid once the receivables were, were
- 1362 submitted to them.
- 1363 **Councilperson McCoy:** Thank you, Mr. Sherman. Ms... Thank you, Mr. Sherman.
- 1364 Finance and Administrative Services Director Sherman: Okay.
- 1365 Councilperson McCoy: Madam Chair?
- 1366 Chairperson Lanier: Yes.
- 1367 **Councilperson McCoy:** Thank you.
- 1368 Ms. Wynn, so, I, I wanna make sure that I'm understanding the requirements of
- the current Lease and the Alpha Education Foundation's ability to offer sublease. I
- believe that there was language, and correct me if I'm wrong, that said that it had to be
- approved by the City. And, help me understand, does that mean Administratively, or
- official action of the body?
- 1373 **City Attorney Wynn:** No. In the actual lease between the City and the Alphas, there
- was a consent to sublease that the City agreed to in the actual Lease.
- 1375 Councilperson McCoy: Mhmm.

- 1376 **City Attorney Wynn:** There was also an attachment of what that form looked like.
- And so, it would only have been signed by Legal and the Clerk, as well as the Alphas.
- 1378 There is a, a signature block for the Mayor and, and the Clerk but it would not have come
- back to the Councill. Because it was agreed to in the entire Lease Agreement between
- the City and Alphas.
- 1381 Councilperson McCoy: Okay. And, until, I guess, January of 2021, how many
- subleases, and specifically what organizations were permitted by Legal to, you know, to
- 1383 be sublet to?
- 1384 City Attorney Wynn: Ms. McBride has that information, I believe. The names of the
- 1385 sublessees.
- 1386 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Oh, the names...
- 1387 **City Attorney Wynn:** Of the subtenants.
- 1388 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** ...of the sublessees?
- 1389 **Councilperson McCoy:** And I'm, I'm speaking of that have been approved by Lega,
- 1390 January 2021.
- 1391 **City Attorney Wynn:** To my knowledge, none of them were approved.
- 1392 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Yeah.
- 1393 City Attorney Wynn: I don't...
- 1394 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** In January it was...
- 1395 **City Attorney Wynn:** ...ha'.., I've not seen any signed by Mr. Degraffenreidt. I have
- drafts of them now. I have not signed them because I was waiting to see what the
- direction from the Council was. The form was already approved and attached to the...
- 1398 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Lease Agreement.
- 1399 City Attorney Wynn: It's called the Sublease Agreement, was already approved
- and attached to the main con'.., the main Lease as well.., Lease Agreement as well. And
- that would only be signed by the tenants, the subtenant and the tenant, the Alphas and
- whoever they were leasing to. They just had an obligation to tell us who those ten'...
- 1403 subtenants are.
- 1404 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Okay.
- 1405 Councilperson McCoy: Follow up.
- 1406 Chairperson Lanier: Yes.

- 1407 **Councilperson McCoy:** So, so in reviewing in your role, in your capacity, Ms. Wynn,
- would you also be verifying that the sublessees comply with the insurance requirements?
- 1409 Would that be one...
- 1410 **City Attorney Wynn:** In con'...
- 1411 **Councilperson McCoy:** ...of the require'...
- 1412 **City Attorney Wynn:** In conjunction with.., in conjunction with Risk, yes.
- 1413 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Yeah.
- 1414 Councilperson McCoy: Okay. And...
- 1415 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Mhmm.
- 1416 **Councilperson McCoy:** So, we've never done that?
- 1417 **City Attorney Wynn:** Not to my knowledge.
- 1418 Councilperson McCoy: Okay.
- Deputy City Manager McBride: Councilman McCoy, in all fairness, it seems as though
- we didn't have in place a process...
- 1421 Councilperson McCoy: Well...
- 1422 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** ...[inaudible]...
- 1423 Councilperson McCoy: Ms. McBride...
- 1424 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Okay.
- 1425 **Councilperson McCoy:** Let me finish because...
- 1426 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Alright.
- 1427 **Councilperson McCoy:** ...you know, every meeting we talk about what we don't have
- in place. It's really hard to see the children that live in this community...
- 1429 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Okay.
- 1430 **Councilperson McCoy:** ...stand on the corner and scrounge for coins, running up to
- vehicles. And that's why I brought this Item up at a meeting. So, as much as I would love
- to support this...
- 1433 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Mhmm.
- 1434 **Councilperson McCoy:** ...if we're not compliant, none of that matters.

- 1435 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Okay.
- 1436 **Councilperson McCoy:** I mean, we lost a City employee. And I have to remind the
- 1437 Members, that we make decisions, and it's gonna sound very harsh and I don't have any
- ill intent, but the decisions that we make, in some cases, decide whether people live or
- 1439 die.
- 1440 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** [Inaudible].
- 1441 **Councilperson McCoy:** And to have somebody on City's property, when we don't even
- have the assurances that there's liability coverage, in the event that somebody's injured,
- 1443 exposes every single taxpayer. And I just wanna make sure that, aside from the
- 1444 processes...
- 1445 [Background music]
- 1446 **Councilperson McCoy:** ...'cause I wanna make a point that Administration goes back
- to know, regardless of whatever the Board decides, three has to be some internal controls
- that we have contract management and somebody looking after these deals, because
- there's no way that this go forward when.., if you're late on your water, your water'll be
- turned off in forty-five days. And we got an organization that's serving the community...
- 1451 **Chairperson Lanier:** Hold on, hold on, Mr. McCoy.
- 1452 [Pause]
- 1453 [Background music then stoops]
- 1454 **Chairperson Lanier:** Alright. Very good.
- 1455 Councilperson McCoy: Well, I think I...
- 1456 [Chuckles]
- 1457 **Councilperson McCoy:** I rest my case, Madam Chair. I don't have nothing else. Hey,
- 1458 we all...
- 1459 [Inaudible dais comments and chuckles]
- 1460 **Councilperson McCoy:** Madam Chair? I, I, I pray we all be ready. That's all I have.
- 1461 [Chuckles]
- 1462 **Chairperson Lanier:** Are there..., are there any other questions from the Board in
- regards to Mr. McCoy, or what was presented by Ms. McBride?
- 1464 [Background music]
- 1465 **Councilperson McCoy:** Hold on one second. Hold on.

- 1466 [Chuckles]
- 1467 **Chairperson Lanier:** Are there any other questions? I, I just wanted to ask one
- 1468 question.
- 1469 **Unk.:** Hmm.
- 1470 **Chairperson Lanier:** The list of issues that we had at the last meeting and we said
- this was supposed to be completed, in its entirety...
- 1472 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Mhmm.
- 1473 **Chairperson Lanier:** Has that happened? That's yes or no.
- 1474 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** No. Not the Code violations.
- 1475 **Chairperson Lanier:** Okay. Very good.
- 1476 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Mhmm.
- 1477 **Chairperson Lanier:** Any other questions from the Board before we get to the
- presentation that the Alphas have prepared for us? [Pause]. If not, the seven-minute
- video, you can show, sir.
- 1480 **Dr. G. Lockhart:** Good evening, Madam Chair, Members of the Council. My name is
- 1481 Dr. George Lockhart. I am the President of Delta Delta Lambda, Alpha Phi Alpha
- 1482 Fraternity, Incorporated.
- 1483 We have come here this evening... And, for those.., the Brothers who are here, if 1484 you can stand up just for a second 'cause you can have a seat again. Then, we're here 1485 to show in definitely the support of what we're doing. I was brought here in January, last couple of months ago, and I was asked high order questions of gueries that I was to 1486 1487 answer in minutes, and I kindly asked for some time. And, the Board allowed for that to 1488 happen. And because it has been several weeks for those same queries. So, we were 1489 able to get that done. Tonight, we're gonna have a medley of speakers, myself... You 1490 all can be seated, Brothers. Thank you. Myself, Mr. Fields, who's the President of the
- 1491 Foundation, and Mr. Finley who's the Director.
- The video you're about to see, it simply is.., talks about the history of the fraternity, talks about the grassroots of what we're doing here, and the youth is very important. It
- comes in three forms, manly deeds, scholarships and love for all mankind.
- Thank you.
- 1496 [Video plays]
- 1497 **Dr. G. Lockhart:** That concludes that particular portion of the video. To answer
- 1498 Councilman's Tradrick McCoy's question, we do not have the students standing out there

on the avenue. I answered that in January. That's not part of our program. We actually [stammer] deter that. Being in education myself, I do understand the [inaudible] after thirty-two years I would definitely not condone that sort of thing.

At this time, in this medley, I'm gonna hand it off to the President, Brother Alfred Fields.

Thank you.

Mr. A. Fields: Good evening and with respect to all of those on the dais, to our Chairperson and all the Councilpersons, to our City Manager, to our Deputy City Manager, I bring you greetings from the Alpha Educational Foundation, DDL, which is under the auspices of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated, Delta Lambda Chapter.

I first wanna say thank you to Council and to the City for allowing us to ingratiate ourselves in this great City of Riviera Beach, to work with the, the youth, the citizens, and yourselves as partners in our endeavors to enhance our community. I do want to give thanks again to Councilperson.., I mean, Deputy City Manager McBride for her efforts and working with us, and counseling with us, to try to make sure we meet the expectations that have been laid before us.

I'm here this afternoon, this evening, to just to give you a little enlightenment about what we have done, what we're doing, and what we plan to do.

Back in 2018, and I think we started in 2017, and discussing this site that is now named the Judge Rogers Center for Community Development. And during that time, we presented an executive summary of what our plans were. I'm going to read into the record what that plan was for the Center.

The mission of the Judge Roger'.., Edward Rogers Center for Community Development is to help the City of Riviera Beach to build a 21st Century community, with equality of opportunity for all of its residents. We aim to do so by providing beneficial programs and services for at risk, high risk, and underserved youth and families residing in and around the City.

As an innovative, social collaborative led by the Alpha Educational Foundation, and the entity of the Delta Delta Lambda Chapter of Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated, the purpose of Rogers Center will be to develop a unique social enterprise consisting of several key community empowerment offerings, designed to provide Rivera Beach residents with the resources, skills, training and potential employment opportunities they need to help strengthen and build the local community.

Additionally, the Foundation and each of its partnering organizations shall, through the use of its primary facility located at 251 West 11th Street in Riviera Beach, Florida, provide cutting edge community benefits to deserving local residents, including but not limited to the following: educational enhancement programs; healthy food and general nutrition resources; musical appreciation and cultural enrichment initiatives; new and

small business incubation services; mental health screening and access to counselling; youth mentoring and recreational sports opportunity; workforce development training and skill based learning.

Just as importantly, partnering with local, state and national groups, organizations and business and industry leaders. The Rogers Center aims to accomplish the following objectives: Create and implementation of various workforce development initiatives, including apprenticeship opportunities in both the marine and hospitality industry that will provide at risk, high risk and underserved youth and juveniles and ex-offenders, with training and job opportunities they need to become productive and contributing members of society.

Creation of an early learning academy, with the stated goal of preparing students for grade school and beyond; development of horticultural programs and community-based farmer's markets that provides fresh fruits, vegetables to residents residing in food deserts; [stammer] implementation of a proprietary musical engineering certification program in partnership with organizations that provide career based skills and employment opportunities in digital music and audio visual industry; development of new business startup incubators, providing entrepreneurship with the infrastructural resources they need to grow and further develop their businesses; creation of mental health services, delivering mech'..., mechanisms whereby we will aim to serve as a liaison to veterans who may be suffering from posttraumatic stress disorder, as well as grief counselling services and other unaddressed mental health needs plaguing the local community; strengthening and expansion of the youth-based local mentoring program; our Men of Tomorrow program, using evidence-based practices and recreational sports opportunities.

That is what we presented back in 2017. Since that time, we consummated a Lease in March of 2018. We undertook the property that's located at 251 West 11th Street, in March, and at that time, of taking on that project, we did not move into a gold mine, but we understand, to whom much is given, much is required. Every gift doesn't come without a price. If I bought a television, I still gotta pay the electric bill, or else I can't watch the television.

This organization, we understood the challenge that we were taking on. And we've encountered them, and we've stepped up to the plate. We put thousand man hours into these modular buildings, that are not made of CVS. We've had to clean, we've had to rip carpet out, we've had to change toilets out, we've had to change lightbulbs, we had to patch holes in walls. All these things we had to do before we could even think about allowing guests to come and, and participate in this property.

So, the entire 2018 year, primarily was used to restore the building to usable condition, not to perfect condition because, if we, we had to do that, our organization funding wasn't in place to do that all at once. Most of the funding that we get is from the back of our brothers. And, we have done that for many years. We have entered into the arena of applying for grants, which we have been getting some movement on those, in some efforts and help with doing some of these repairs.

But we did not do a ribbon cutting until December of 2018. So, I know, I can count the number of brothers in here, and the number of hours they spent taking down graded work that was still stapled to the walls in the building, removing all types of materials that were left in the building. We didn't have a dumpster on the property, but we had brothers with connections that got dumpsters donated. And I didn't know we couldn't have a, a dumpster that wasn't from Solid Waste in the City of Riviera Beach, until Code came by and said, 'You got a dumpster here that doesn't supposed to be here.' We had a brother who had a connection with a contractor who had donated us a dumpster so that we could clean up. And when the City came by, the City Inspector came by and said that, we had the dumpster removed. And that's how we were managing this property, on the backs of our brothers, and the funding out of their pockets.

So, and in December, we had the ribbon cutting. We were able to then move forward. We had several members of the Council that was present at the ribbon cutting. Since that time, we've had numerous of programs there, where we've always invited the entire City Council, we've always invited all the citizens of Riviera Beach and the surrounding areas, and we've had programs there that have benefitted this City and its residents. And particularly, our youth. We've even had our Chief of Police come speak to our Men of Tomorrow program there.

We've worked with the medical society, T. Leroy Jefferson Medical Society and put on a major back to school workshop, where they came and gave free physicals to our students going back to school. And we gave out backpacks and school supplies. We've had major food giveaways at the location, where we've actually had drive-thru service where people didn't get out of their cars. And this was before the pandemic. We didn't start this after the pandemic, we started before.

And then, a year after that, January.., Feb'.., March of last year, as we were starting to hit our stride, we had the pandemic. So, this past year, we've been crippled, as in most places, by the pandemic. And so, yes, we haven't been able to do all the things that we had planned to do and would like to do, but it hasn't stopped our motivation and drive. And I tell you, this is personal for me. You know, I'm a little country boy from a city called Belle Glade, where.., and, and raised in a city called South Bay, where's there's one traffic light and not a whole lotta people thought anybody coming from there would be anything. And I can tell you, the God I serve said no.

[Audience exclamation]

- Mr. A. Fields: So, this is very personal to me. And so, when you talk about Alpha and you talk about my brothers, and when you talk about our students and our kids, it gets personal. And I had to tell Ms. McBride that, and she, she said she understood because we don't get paid for this. This is a labor of love. Because I understand, to whom much is given, much is required.
- And so with hat, I'm gonna turn it over to Brother Finley because I could go on talking about our love for our community and what Alpha has done in Palm Beach County...

- 1621 Chairperson Lanier: Yes.
- 1622 **Mr. A. Fields:** ...since 1947.
- 1623 **Chairperson Lanier:** Thank you. Thank you, sir.
- 1624 **Mr. A. Fields:** So, thank you.
- 1625 **Chairperson Lanier:** Is there any other presentation for this Item? [Pause]. Alright.
- 1626 Very good.
- 1627 **Mr. A. Fields:** [Inaudible], Brother Finely.
- 1628 **Chairperson Lanier:** Thank you, sir. [Pause]. How long is this... What is this that
- we have here?
- 1630 **Mr. B. Finley:** There's a time constraint? 'Cause...
- 1631 **Chairperson Lanier:** Five minutes.
- 1632 **Mr. B. Finley:** ...I make it short.
- 1633 Chairperson Lanier: Five minutes, sir.
- 1634 **Mr. B. Finley:** I can make it short.
- 1635 **Chairperson Lanier:** Thank you, sir.
- 1636 **Mr. B. Finley:** Thank you so much.
- Good evening to the Council and all of you all. Just wanna say a few things, and I will. 'Cause I can keep short. I am a preacher by trade, so I can keep it very, very short.
- 1639 What I wanna say tonight, I've heard a lotta things and I can understand the issue 1640 on the table. I came from the business world. I say, what you see before you also, is 1641 someone that grew up in this City. And when I grew up in this City, I could not do a lotta things here. I couldn't even become a boy scout in this City because, when we did a 1642 1643 troop for a whole year, we could not get one male figure to allow us to become a boy scout. So, it's personal to me. I understand. When I took over the Men of Tomorrow 1644 program some years ago, it always had been my dream to do what God has put me to 1645 1646 do.
- And so, we come tonight, Council... Let me sum up my, my presentation real quickly for you. I wanna say to you all, I come tonight to ask you for a partnership. We came to do a job that the Honorable Judge Rogers said in a meeting one night, and he had a vision, and that vision inspired me. And so, we came to 251 West 11th Street, we had no money. Only what was in our pockets, lint in our pockets and a couple dollars.
- But, we never gave up and we still strive, regardless of the roaches that crossed our feet.
- regardless of the things that we saw in that building. The things that we saw on the

outside, the things that some of you all may have rode by many days before we got that property, and we worked, worked and we worked. And, and in between working, we tried to do the job.

And so, we come tonight to say to you, that we come to make an appeal, an appeal to be partners because this is the City of Riviera Beach. I love this City. So, we come to work at 251. We didn't come to sit down, we didn't come to complain, we didn't come to gripe, but what we came to do, tonight, after showing you a presentation, we've been there just about three years. And in three years, in between working, in between doing and some of you City Councils, I've seen you there, and I appreciate your presence. And you have taken hold of some of the programs there. You've seen Pastor Nelson doing her job, you've seen Acts of Kindness, you've seen Sounds of Success doing what they do. And we also see them because they are our partners as well as our tenants. But we take it in stride because we are in partnership with them, and we allowed them to come because we wanted them to grab hold of the vision.

So, we're here tonight, Council, and we appreciate you all. And what we're saying tonight, we're not here to argue and gripe or complain, but what we wanna do, we have a vision. We've grabbed hold of some, some community partners and some organizations, so we are going to move forward to do what we need to do.

I wanna thank you so much. And we appreciate your time and your attention tonight.. And we just ask you, take consideration to join us in this partnership.

1674 Thank you.

- **Chairperson Lanier:** Thank you, sir.
- 1676 [Applause]

- **Chairperson Lanier:** Yes. You're recognized
- **Councilperson McCoy:** Thank you, Madam Chair.

So, I wanna get all of the Members attention, Ms. McBride, Mr. Evans, and Ms. Wynn because I'm very confused. This is not the Shark Tank. We brought this issue here to address the noncompliance. And, the gentleman that just left, I wanna.., I believe he said Milton, he said he knows what's on the table. I'm confused, because I don't know what's on the table. We wanted to address the simple concerns that wasn't being followed in the current agreement, and this seems to turn into more or less a pitch. And I'm not exactly sure what the expectation is with this presentation.

You know, we brought up that these were noncompliant issues, that were very serious for the City and for anybody that actually was at the property. But, the whole emotional appeal, you know, I empathize, and I certainly understand but what exactly are we expected to do? What are we looking to do, Members? And that is very much an open-ended question, and I'm gonna ask for the dialog again, because, you know, I, I

- 1691 guess I have the wrong impression because I thought we were gonna deal with the
- 1692 compliance issues. And, you know, that was the extent of the presentation.
- So, Mr. Evans, I'm looking for direction [inaudible] Ms. McBride.
- 1694 **Councilperson Lawson:** Madam Chair?
- 1695 **Chairperson Lanier:** Yes. Mr. Lawson. I'm sorry...
- 1696 **Councilperson Lawson:** Thank you.
- 1697 **Chairperson Lanier:**Councilman Lawson.
- 1698 **Councilperson Lawson:** Thank you.
- 1699 Ms. McBride, can you give us a list of the outstanding violations that are still
- incurring with the property?
- 1701 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Yes.
- 1702 **Councilperson Lawson:** Thank you.
- 1703 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** I think in, what.., the Manager sent you an email that
- 1704 related, about a month ago...
- 1705 Councilperson Lawson: Mhmm.
- 1706 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** ...and the violations. Mr. Grimm cited them for.., he
- gave them some dates to comply, ranging from March 1st 'til some times in June. So,
- some of those violations are still, still pending.
- 1709 **Chairperson Lanier:** What was your question, Mr. Lawson? I'm sorry.
- 1710 **Councilperson Lawson:** A list of the outstanding violations.
- 1711 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Violations.
- 1712 Chairperson Lanier: Okay.
- 1713 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** It's about two and half pages, Mr. Lawson.
- 1714 **Councilperson Lawson:** And we have...
- 1715 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Because it, it's...
- 1716 **Councilperson Lawson:** And we have deadlines listed on those two...
- 1717 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Yes.

- 1718 Councilperson Lawson: ...and a half pages...
- 1719 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** He has...
- 1720 Councilperson Lawson: ...correct?
- 1721 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** ...deadlines. And Mr. Grimm is here, and he can
- answer too. He said, of course, some of them they met the deadline, some they haven't.
- You know, with giving and take with the compliance, yeah.
- 1724 Councilperson Lawson: And this is in reference.., and, I'm, I'm asking, this is in
- reference to the Building Official's inspections. Is there anything else that's outstanding
- 1726 outside of these?
- 1727 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** [Stammer]... Just Ms. Wynn's review of the consents.
- Once she signs off on them, all parties can apply for their BTRs.
- 1729 Councilperson Lawson: Okay. And, Attorney Wynn, when will that review be
- 1730 completed?
- 1731 **City Attorney Wynn:** It can be this week.
- 1732 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Mhmm.
- 1733 Councilperson Lawson: Okay.
- 1734 **City Attorney Wynn:** I wanted to get the direction from the Council first.
- 1735 **Councilperson Lawson:** Mhmm.
- 1736 **City Attorney Wynn:** Which is what I stated earlier.
- 1737 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Mhmm.
- 1738 **City Attorney Wynn:** But, yeah. If you all [inaudible]...
- 1739 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** And one, one other thing, Mr. Lawson.
- 1740 **Councilperson Lawson:** Thank you.
- 1741 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** The Solid Waste fees, remember I told you they just
- got their figure this afternoon. The amount.., they just were provided the cost of that,
- sometime after 1:00 p.m. this afternoon. So, they need to review them, and they are
- working with Mr. Sherman to resolve those.
- 1745 **City Attorney Wynn:** And also, if I can interject. The one issue, Ms. McBride
- 1746 [inaudible], the insurance of a subtenant, auto insurance.

- 1747 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Yeah. And I don't wanna call the tenant's name out...,
- auto only. But, the major insurance they have.
- 1749 **Councilperson Lawson:** Okay.
- 1750 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** And they were in compliance until sometime today.
- 1751 **City Attorney Wynn:** Right.
- 1752 **Councilperson Lawson:** Okay.
- 1753 **City Attorney Wynn:** So that one will not be signed until they...
- 1754 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Right.
- 1755 **City Attorney Wynn:** ...can provide that.
- 1756 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Mhmm.
- 1757 **Councilperson Lawson:** So, outstanding are the list of..., I see a deadline for every item
- on here from our Building Official. They've come in compliance with everything that we
- have to review, the Lease Agreements. Ms. Wynn, you'll have that for us this week, and
- the figure has been presented to the organization from Solid Waste.
- 1761 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Right.
- 1762 **Councilperson Lawson:** Anything else that's outstanding?
- 1763 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Well, the City comes up with the figure. Mr. Sherman
- 1764 presented those this afternoon.
- 1765 **Councilperson Lawson:** That has been presented?
- 1766 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** This afternoon they did.
- 1767 **Councilperson Lawson:** Okay.
- 1768 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Okay?
- 1769 **Councilperson Lawson:** So, with the deadlines here. So colleagues, as Councilman
- 1770 McCoy stated, I believe we were here just to make a determination based on what's
- outstanding. So, moving forward, the deadlines that were provided by the Building Official
- and, given that expectation, I would be inclined to follow and give them the opportunity to
- 1773 complete these items, following the dates that were received, giving Attorney Wynn the
- opportunity to review the leases, and coming to the next meeting with feedback. And
- then, moving forward with offering the sublet.
- 1776 Question in regards to the subletting agreement. We have to approve that in their Lese for allowing for the organization to sublease.

- 1778 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Right.
- 1779 **Councilperson Lawson:** Do we have any restrictions that are currently in place, in the
- current Lese, or is that something that we would be able to put in, restrictive measures?
- 1781 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** I think Ms. Wynn would need to answer...
- 1782 **City Attorney Wynn:** Yeah.
- 1783 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** ...that question.
- 1784 **City Attorney Wynn:** There are no restrictions.
- 1785 Councilperson McCoy: Well...
- 1786 **City Attorney Wynn:** It hasn't, it hasn't expired, and so, we haven't recommended
- any changes to the original Lease Agreement, because it still ongoing.
- 1788 Councilperson Lawson: Okay. So there were no restrictions in the original Lese
- 1789 Agreement. So, we sublet.., we leased the building in March 2018, and it was five-year
- 1790 lease?
- 1791 **City Attorney Wynn:** Restrictions...
- 1792 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** [Inaudible].
- 1793 **City Attorney Wynn:** One restriction is that they lease.., sublease to nonprofits.
- 1794 **Councilperson Lawson:** Nonprofit. So, but with no cap in regards to pricing?
- 1795 **City Attorney Wynn:** No.
- 1796 **Councilperson Lawson:** Okay. And then, the terms of the Lease were a five-year
- 1797 lease?
- 1798 **City Attorney Wynn:** Correct.
- 1799 Councilperson Lawson: So, moving forward, what I would be inclined is to add an
- amendment to the actual Lease, to put some oversight in regards to some of the subletting
- in the process moving forward. We have to keep a checks and balance with the process
- of making sure that our partners within the City, that's done an amazing job in the
- community, and everybody is held accountable. [Inaudible]...
- 1804 **City Attorney Wynn:** Mr. Lawson, we would need to know.., I would need to know
- what's..., moving forward, as you stated, what, what sort of oversight? You..., if, if you're
- talking about amending the Lease or in a new lease in.., at the end of this term.
- 1807 **Councilperson Lawson:** Well, I would actually, to continue on with this process, wanna
- add an amendment to the Lease, restricting or capping the amount of rent for subletting.

Being that the Alphas have put in.., the Alpha Phi [stammer] Foundation has put in a lot of sweat equity and actual dollars into this building and this property, we don't want to ignore that point, but we also do wanna look at the fact that we wanna try to pass the opportunity and savings onto the nonprofits that are currently there as well.

I would like us to move forward with the organization and allowing for them to retain this property, but making sure that we have requirements in place, like the insurance that we're asking for all of our tenants and sublets to have, the BTRs to be applied for. But, also capping or restricting the amount of rent that's being charged for these units.

1817 Councilperson McCoy: Madam Chair? Madam Chair, I wanna respond.

Chairperson Lanier: Yes. You're recognized.

Councilperson McCoy: So, thank you for starting it.

So, I have..., one, one of my concerns is, I, I think certainly, Ms. Wynn, I wanna make sure we capture, and I mentioned this to both Ms.., Ms. Wynn and also the Manager, that this property was granted to the City of Riviera Beach with very specific restrictions. And I think if we're going to continue to allow any sorts of programming, we have to stipulate specifically the same restrictions that's provided for in the restrictive clause within the deed. And I'll just give you the brief, very, very brief portion of, of civic, public or governmental purposes. And obviously, public is a pretty broad definition, so I would make sure that we wanna include. Because, you know, I'm, I'm almost inclined to ask that if we go back to an amendment, we require a financial statement for the operation of this property because I'm looking currently at the amount of rent that's being received by the Alpha Education Foundation for the subtenants and I know, based on the Lease, what we're requiring the Alpha Education Foundation to pay the City of Riviera Beach, and there is a huge margin there. And I imagine, and I certainly appreciate that they've done some significant improvements.

But, going back to the Minutes, from 2018, I think it was Board Member Hubbard.., and I have the actual quote here. And Members, I.., please just indulge me. I have it highlighted. Councilperson.., or, Pro Tem Hubbard said at the time, "Madam Chair, my comments are this. While we did vote unanimously for the Alphas to use it, some of the concerns that are being raised bother me to the extent, when you have a volunteer organization, men of the statue and organization as old as this, that has come to give to our community, not asking for anything in return, not making money from subleases.' Well, I will hope that that's true because when I'm looking at these margins, there's certainly a whole lot of money that's being collected from subtenants that I don't see the result reflected in, in the property. And, we're talking about hundreds.., hundreds of percents of, of a profit margin. And, I wouldn't be able to say that with certainty unless I see the financial statements, but I don't see that you can have this kind of overhead when you only are responsible for paying the City one hundred dollars a month.

And I wanna certainly make sure that.., it'd be my position to offer an amendment... Well, first of all, we have to first establish that there's been noncompliance, which is a

material breach. And then if we do choose to go back, then we can then offer an agreement because.., you know, even.., I gotta defer to Councilwoman Botel because I even looked at some of her comments when this came up and she wanted specific measurables. And, some of these things.., and, you know, quite honestly, I haven't see them.

And I'm not closing the door, I just wanna make sure that we cannot sit here and act like we don't have a responsibility to be good stewards of the City's resources. And especially those that came through by the School District, when we have very.., we have very stringent requirements, such as being civic public and government purpose. If we can't even establish that this was a bona fide public interest, or a public purpose, being that we have organizations that's paying rent and we have a number of deficiencies, it almost seems no different than what we see when we have all these Code violations with slumlords.

So, I'm gonna move on from that point, but certain, it'd be my opinion that if we offer an amendment, that we encompass the specific language that's in the restrictive covenants of the deed, and also require the sub'.., require the tenants to provide a lease, if not quarterly, annually.

1883	rental amounts received. I was looking in the backup to see what the amounts were that
1884	Councilman McCoy was discussing, from the sublet. Since

- 1885 **Chairperson Lanier:** I would like to know that as well. How much.., from the time
- that the, the Alphas got this building until now, how much money has been collected in
- rents from the nonprofits that have been on that site? Maybe that could be answered
- 1888 by...
- 1889 Councilperson Lawson: Well, the...
- 1890 **Chairperson Lanier:** ...by the Finance Director. I'm not sure who...
- 1891 Councilperson Lawson: I think that's what Councilman McCoy was asking for, the
- financials. But, in regards to the margins, where did you fi'... Did you get those from...
- 1893 Councilperson McCoy: Well...
- 1894 **Councilperson Lawson:** ...Staff or is that....
- 1895 **Councilperson McCoy:** You know...
- 1896 **Councilperson Lawson:** ...in the backup?
- 1897 **Councilperson McCoy:** ...I, I, I don't wanna be presumptuous, 'cause I don't know that
- they have been charging this, and I don't wanna speak to that, but this is what I've been
- 1899 provided today as going forward. I don't...
- 1900 Chairperson Lanier: Okay.
- 1901 Councilperson McCoy: [Inaudible].
- 1902 Chairperson Lanier: We'll, we'll, we'll come back to that. Let us let our...
- 1903 **Councilperson Lawson:** Thank you, Madam Chair.
- 1904 **Chairperson Lanier:** ...public comment go.
- 1905 **Ms. M. Shepherd:** Margaret Shepherd, Riviera Beach.

Just the messenger again. This was one of the topics that the lady brought up about the Judge Rogers Center. Judge Rogers was very close to my family. We always communicated, went over to Thanksgiving. So, we were very close. And when I saw this on the Agenda, I think the 1st of the year, it kinda tore me apart because the Alphas and a/k/a which, I have family members in there. I think they do a excellent job.

A friend of mine, her mother, I think, had COVID. And, she couldn't work because she had to take care of her mother. And, she went over to see Sister Nelson. I'm just saying the story that was told to me. And, Sister Nelson helped her. I think they had 1914 clothes over there, I think they had food over there, and she said, Sister Nelson said, 1915 'Anytime you want anything, please come to me.' And that did a lot for her, because she 1916 was closed in.

These are things coming to the City. I enjoy when I go through 13th Street, see the children rolling around and playing in the grass, playing kickball. And since we're not doing nothing in the City, everything shut down, for the children, I would hope that we will not continue. When things come in.., I understand they had a few problems, but what, what really gets me is that the tiki bar, I think you all gave him a half million dollars, just to build it out.

- 1924 **Ms. M. Shepherd:** Just to build it out. And then I heard you say you're gonna pay half for the awnings. To me, I think that man have enough money to do whatever he has to do. I understand the taxes, but this is nonprofit. This is nonprofit. I don't see why we're digging.., this is wrong, that is wrong. You have to look on the.., as my grandmother said, 'The bright side.' And the bright side is making sure that our children are secure. [Stammer] these men just absolutely resonate greatness.
- This is why this program need' to stay over three, the shootings, the killings. If you can get at least one kid, or two kids, over there and have these people mentor them, I think this City would be proud and proud. But, we continue to find fault, everything's... And understand they have problems, I understand. But show me one family that don't have problems.
- And they are nonprofit. So to me, that make' them exceptionally wonderful people, to me, because they don't have to give their time. They don't have to do fundraisers. They don't have to do.., well, they said they cleaned it up. Well, I, I pretty much seen them out there working one particular day.
- So I hope that we will kind of make sure that whatever we do for one...

1948 Chairperson Lanier: Mr. Lawson?

1949 Councilperson Lawson: I'll come bac, Madam Chair.

1950 **Chairperson Lanier:** Okay. Ms. Miller-Anderson?

1951 **Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson:** Well, you know, I was on the Board when this came up initially and the way in which it was done, you know, there were probably some issues, some things that could've been hammered out a little more, so that we probably wouldn't be in this situation. But, I, I do understand that the Alphas have done an outstanding job, especially with the programs that have been there, the other nonprofits that are there.

If they have outstanding issues that need to be completed, you know, I mean, Ms., Ms. Shepherd did bring up a very valid point. And, and, you know, and that's why we have to have consistency in, in what we do because people will refer to other things that have been done. Speaking of the Rafiki Tiki. You know, I mean, there's a lotta concessions that were given there and when we make decisions, we have to make sure that we're consistent because people do not forget. And so, we don't want to seem like we're doing.., we're favoring one group, when we're not favoring the other.

Obviously, if there's any life safety issues that need to be addressed, that is important. I don't think that's.., we can't negotiate on that.

What, what.., the, the items that have these dates that are listed here, like I see some for March 1st and... Are those.., are we saying all of those have been met or? 'Cause I can't really determine if it's been met, or if this is just saying what the deadline was.

- 1970 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** We can have Mr. Michael Grimm, our Building Official come forward.
- 1972 Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson: Okay.
- 1973 **Deputy City Manager McBride:** He'll address those.
- 1974 Thank you.

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1975 **Building Official Grimm:** Good evening. My name is Michael Grimm. I'm the Building 1976 Official for Riviera Beach.

1977 I've been at the Judge Rogers Center several times over the last month, checking 1978 on the progress on the, the list of items that I gave to the Alphas to address. To be fair 1979 to the Alphas, these items did predate their tenure there. They've been items that were 1980 falling apart on that prop'.., property for many years due to neglect.

And, so, these.., the list I gave them has a, a lot of suggested deadlines. They're not written in stone, but they're deadlines that I felt were, were easy to meet. Some of

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them could be harder to meet those. Some, some of the siding, could take a longer time to meet. But, I, I was hoping that they would use that list to prioritize some of the issues, like the electric, the double detector check valve.

So, I, I can give you some highlights of what they've done there, starting with the main building. That building was in actually pretty good shape when I went for my first inspection. And you could tell that they had put all their main efforts into that building originally, 'cause it had very little wrong with it. The thing that I gave them to fix there was the roof drainage, which they needed to reconnect some of the leaders and direct the, the water from the roof, away from the foundation piers. And they did that immediately. They met that deadline.

The double detector check assembly was leaking, they fixed that. They fixed some of the electrical issues.

The Florida Fishing Academy had a few electrical issues that they fixed inside. The, the irrigation valve box, they put a cover on it. I do not think that they fixed the irrigation there, because it does look a little bit dry. But, they did start fixing a lot of it, the landscaping outside on the westside of the property. And they started cleaning up a lotta stuff that had been left there by previous people that had that property. They still have a ways to go on that, but they did make a significant dent.

The, the skirting. They took all the skirting off of the buildings, which I'm happy they did that 'cause that's gonna help look at the structural piers and the strapping underneath there. And I was happy to find out that most of those are in actually pretty good shape. There's only a few that need to be readjusted.

The walkways. They're relatively sturdy, although they, they do need to be adjusted. They're not in danger, but they do need to be adjusted and, and change some of the wood blocking to cement. And, they still need to remove a little bit of the electrical that's exposed on some of the areas. I do not believe they're live.

They have a, a lot of work to do on the siding, which might take longer than the deadline that I gave them. But they have made significant progress and I'm, I'm happy with what they're doing so far.

- **Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson:** So, in your opinion though, are, are there any items on here that remain open, where it, it's a danger?
- Building Official Grimm: Not, not immediate danger. A lot of the electrical items are just missing.., a missing cover plate. Some of the electric is not being used t but they're supposed to be removed so that you can make sure that it's not an exposed wire. But it, it appears not to be a live wire, 'cause I went out with some testers. But, I required them to remove them 'cause, one, they're unsightly and, and you need to be able to look at something to make sure that it's.., it's in the Code that you have to remove unused wiring.
 - So, there's nothing that I, I felt was of any immediate life safety danger. But there are violations that need to be taken care of.

- 2022 **Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson:** And, and in, in those rooms, or office spaces,
- are there children where these things are exposed? Or are they...
- 2024 **Building Official Grimm:** No. Mo'.., most of the exposed wiring was on the outside of
- the, of the, the buildings, typically in, in rear areas. And, like I said, I brought a tester over
- and, and so none of them were live. And.., but I, I do require them to remove them. So,
- that we can know, anytime I look at it, that it's, it's not a live exposed wire.
- 2028 **Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson:** Okay. That's it for now. Thank you.
- 2029 **Chairperson Lanier:** Thank you. Councilwoman Botel?
- 2030 Councilperson Botel: You know, I, I always chuckle to myself when I see Alfred
- Fields come up to a microphone worried that he's gonna say, She, she voted against us.'
- 2032 [Chuckle]. In 2018. And I did. I did. I had a lotta guestions. But, I've been over there
- so much in the [stammer] intervening years and I've seen so many good things going on.
- 2034 I, I pay regular visits to Pastor Nelson...
- 2035 [Applause]
- 2036 **Councilperson Botel:** I, I, I always wanna pick up my saxophone and get involved in
- the Sounds of Success.
- 2038 So, I..., again, my concerns were that there were safety issues, obviously. And I do actually, too, have concerns about the rents that people are paying. You know, we 2039 2040 are often approached to give community benefit dollars to some of those 501(c)(3)s that are over there and, and they lament about the rents that they pay there. So, I hope, in 2041 2042 the future, you can take a look at the rents that are being charged. And I know, I haven't 2043 even looked myself at the total number. I'm sure Mr. McCov, our accountant on Staff 2044 here [chuckle] has taken a look at the total number of rents that have been collected, and 2045 he knows that information. I don't know what it is exactly. But, I do know that it's been a 2046 struggle for some of the people over there and, and I would hope that you'd look at the 2047 rents and say, 'Hey, you know, maybe we can readjust some of them.'

So if they continue to do the good work that I know.., that I know you want them to continue, I am always, always happy to see that Captain Rich Brochu is working with our children. He does, as you know.., well know, because you're there, he, he does a wonderful job with the Florida Fishing Academy, takes many of our kids out, teaches them how to fish, instructs them about the marine life that we are so used to here in this community.

So, I, I applaud the work that you're doing, but again, I'm happy that you're, you're taking a look at the safety issues and I do hope you'll take a look at the rents that are being charged and see if there's some, some leeway that can be given to the 501(c)(3)s that are there.

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2059 **Chairperson Lanier:** Thank you. Councilman Lawson?

2060 **Councilperson Lawson:** That was everything, Madam Chair.

Thank you.

Chairperson Lanier: Thank you. Are there any other questions or comments for this Item? I wanted to say I was kind of disappointed that all of the issues were not addressed. That was the deal that we had in our last meeting, that all of the issues that were brought up would be addressed. And I still have not gotten a figure of the total amount of money from the time the Alphas took over that building until now in terms of what has been collected from nonprofits for rent in that area? How.., what, what is that amount? Somebody?

2069 Councilperson McCoy: Madam Chair?

2070 Chairperson Lanier: Yes.

Councilperson McCoy: Well, you know, I guess we never really... Excuse me. We 2071 2072 never really got that involved. You know, I looked back at the video and I can remember 2073 Board Member Davis Johnson saying if we wanted to terminate this as the City.., and I, and I, Members, I, I just wanna make sure I get your attention and I'm gonna proffer 2074 2075 something and it's gonna go to the point that you're about to suggest, Board Member Davis Johnson said, 'There's not even,' and I believe even Ms.., Councilwoman Miller-2076 2077 Anderson also chimed in and said, 'There's no provision that if we as a City wanted to 2078 terminate this, we don't have any ability to do it, unless there is a material default and 2079 they become incompliant. That's the only provision that we can terminate this.' And I'm 2080 not sitting here suggesting that I wanna do that. But, I want, in the spirt of reasoning, be 2081 able to obtain exactly what you're looking for, Councilwoman.., Chairperson Lanier, and 2082 knowing what that is that we're... what that they're collecting and passing on that co'... that rent cost to those users, and then that be worked into a modified agreement. 2083 2084 Because I don't care if there's no provisions now that require them to provide that 2085 information. I think it would just be a gesture of good faith.

But I'm ready to even, you know, at this point, provided that we can get past these Code issues, I'm really ready to offer that we go back and send the Attorney back to renegotiate because there's no doubt, not paying in thirty-two months is definitely a material incompliance. And not having insurance and the safety issues, are obviously a, a material noncompliance.

So, I mean, I, I don't know what that number is, and I don't know if it's proprietary, but going forward, I think if we rework the agreement, we can put in provisions that require them. That would be my suggestion, Madam Chair.

2094 I yield back.

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Chairperson Lanier: Thank you. And I, I still want to know that number, regardless of whether it is proprietary or not. I think it is material to what is on the table here. What

is material is the fact that there are serious Code compliances with this [stammer], with this property. And, the money that has been received was supposed to be put back into the property. That was the original agreement that, whatever monies that would be received from nonprofits, that whatever money would be [stammer] earned from them holding the Lease, and them having subleases, would be put back into the property. And apparently, that did not happen.

2103 Now...

Councilperson Botel: Madam Chair?

2105 Chairperson Lanier: ...what...

2106 Councilperson Lawson: Madam Chair?

Chairperson Lanier: Let me finish, please.

2108 Councilperson Botel: Okay.

Chairperson Lanier: Now, what I will say is that it is not all on them, that the City has some..., bears some burden in this issue because there was a lax of oversight, there was just not..., nothing happening in terms of what the City was supposed to do to ensure that this project was successful. So, I, I will not sit here and say that this is all on the Alphas. The City bears a, a significant part in what is transpiring and how we got to where we are today.

But with that being said, I know that the Alphas do good work. I've seen them at my alma mater, Florida A&M University, I've seen them here, and I've seen them in, in different..., in various locations and geographic areas and doing excellent work. So I have no doubt about that. What I want to happen at this point, is that I want to be able to move forward, but I want to be able to be clear about what the expectations are from the City, and from this organization.

So, with that being said, I want the Board to be able to come up with the direction of where we want to go, how we want to go, and what we want to see in terms of an amended agreement, in terms of next steps, and in terms of, as Dr. Botel has suggested, evalue'.., evaluative and measurable outcomes. Not just for the nonprofits that are there, but for the Alpha program itself. What are your measurable objectives? What are you trying to accomplish at this site, other than being a landlord? And I know that you have some very good ideas, I know you have some very good programs, and we'd like to see those flourish and come to fruition.

And, and the City can be a partner in terms of making sure that this happens. But, I want us to move forward, if we are, if we..., to move forward, with the understanding that this type of scenario cannot come back before us. This type of missteps..., and I, and as I'll say again, on our parts as well, that we need to move forward with the understanding that everybody knows where everybody stands and what the expectations are.

2134 So, ;with that being said, I will turn it over to my colleagues to provide suggestions 2135 and next steps for how we move forward with this project. 2136 Mr. Lawson. 2137 Councilperson Lawson: Thank you, Madam Chair. 2138 Attorney Wynn, based on the terms of the Lease, are.., is the Foundation obligated 2139 to provide financials for their organization? **City Attorney Wynn:** We can request them. It's up to them to tell us if they believe 2140 that they are not..., if they don't want to produce them, and under what provision of the 2141 2142 law they don't have to produce them. 2143 Councilperson Lawson: Okay. So, in addition to that, we are not.., we're not entitled to the sublet lease agreements as well, correct? 2144 2145 **City Attorney Wynn:** We are entitled to the sublease agreements. 2146 Councilperson Lawson: So... 2147 **City Attorney Wynn:** We have... Councilperson Lawson: ...we're entitled... 2148 ...them. 2149 **City Attorney Wynn:** 2150 **Councilperson Lawson:** And we have not received those? 2151 **City Attorney Wynn:** We have them. Councilperson Lawson: We have them? 2152 Deputy City Manager McBride: Mhmm. 2153 2154 **City Attorney Wynn:** Yes. sir. 2155 **Councilperson Lawson:** Okay. Is that what you're gonna be reviewing this week? 2156 **City Attorney Wynn:** Yes. Councilperson Lawson: Okay. So then we'll be able to get financials in regards to 2157 2158 what each organization is being charged? **City Attorney Wynn:** 2159 Yes. 2160 Councilperson Lawson: Okay. 2161 **City Attorney Wynn:** Mhmm. We'll...

- 2162 Councilperson Lawson: The...
- **City Attorney Wynn:** ...we'll request them.
- **Deputy City Manager McBride:** Yeah.
- **Councilperson Lawson:** The Foundation is not also obligated to amend the terms of
- the Lease, correct?
- **City Attorney Wynn:** That's correct.
- **Councilperson Lawson:** So, in the event that we wanted to amend the Lease, it would
- be comparable to what Councilman McCoy stated, in good faith, working out terms that
- 2170 are in agreement with the Council and the Foundation?
- **City Attorney Wynn:** That's correct.
- **Councilperson Lawson:** Okay. So, in good faith, what I would wanna see is having a
- 2173 discussion, continuation, allowing for it to be the Code violations to be brought up to st'...
- 2174 up to standard, for all requirements previously, to be addressed. And then having,
- 2175 whether it's a possible workshop or discussion, to figure out the process of moving
- forward, in good faith negotiating terms that the City Council and the organization can
- 2177 work forward with.

I do believe that's some measurable should be put in place. I do believe that a cap or percentage should be put on the nonprofit organizations that are currently being worked with. But, understanding real estate, finance and operations business and being in a fraternity myself, the work that the organization does has to be funded. So, the money that has been put in, the sweat equity and the dollar amount, we need to make sure that we operate fairly as well.

Visiting the site, I've seen the work that the Alphas are doing. I've seen the work that the nonprofits in that building are doing, so I want us to continue to be a good steward and a good partner with each other. So, how we do that is by meeting, discussing it and coming to an agreement that's gonna work out for all parties.

And I really wanna continue to support this endeavor with this building. We have about three years.., two years left on this current Lease. But the work that's been done, I don't want it to be discredited, I want it to continue to make it flourish, and I wanna continue to support it, because this organization is vital to this community, based on the Men of Tomorrow, based on the fraternity, Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity, Incorporated, and the nonprofits they support there.

So, we can continue to provide support, but possible workshop to discuss the terms, whereas, the Council discussing exactly what our requirements and expectations are, and present them to the Alphas and they can counter. Whichever is the easiest means to get this done in an expedited fashion.

- Thank you, Madam Chair.
- 2199 **Chairperson Lanier:** Thank you.
- So, how do we move forward, Board? Are we going to include in this amended
- agreement.., are, are we under the.., are we in agreement that we're going to amend
- 2202 this.., amend this contract that we have with the, with the Alphas?
- 2203 Councilperson McCoy: Ma'...
- 2204 Chairperson Lanier: Mr. McCov?
- 2205 **Councilperson McCoy:** Well, I guess.., it, it seems that we can agree, but hey have to
- 2206 voluntarily agree. So, we need to be asking them would they be amenable to an
- agreement. We can offer it, but unless they want to amend the terms, then it's...
- 2208 **Chairperson Lanier:** I... Okay. Are you amenable to an, an amendment, Alphas?
- 2209 Councilperson Lawson: Ma'.., Madam Chair?
- 2210 **Chairperson Lanier:** Hold on a second, sir.
- 2211 **Unk.:** [Inaudible].
- 2212 **Chairperson Lanier:** Yes, sir. Please.
- 2213 **Mr. A. Fields:** Thank you again for the opportunity.
- 2214 Can I, can I have a statement bore...?
- 2215 **Chairperson Lanier:** No. I just want you to answer the question, sir.
- 2216 **Mr. A. Fields:** We're amenable to working with the City, and the...
- 2217 **Chairperson Lanier:** Are you amenable to a, to an am'.., amended agreement with
- the City, currently? That's the question.
- 2219 **Mr. A. Fields:** We're, we're willing to sit down and work with the City to try to
- work out our differences in what we're, we're talking about. What those...
- 2221 **Chairperson Lanier:** So you are amenable to a, a, a, an amendment to your
- 2222 contract? That's what I'm asking you. It's...
- 2223 **Mr. A. Fields:** If...
- 2224 **Chairperson Lanier:** ...a yes or no question, sir.
- 2225 **Mr. A. Fields:** If it's reasonable, yes.

- 2226 **Chairperson Lanier:** Okay. Very good.
- 2227 Councilperson McCoy: Well...
- 2228 Councilperson Lawson: Madam...
- 2229 Councilperson McCoy: ...so...
- 2230 Chairperson Lanier: Mr. McCoy.
- 2231 **Councilperson McCoy:** So, let me just preface this because here, here, here's the
- thing. We can do it one of two ways. We can declare.., make a motion and declare that
- they've been noncompliant, then basically the Lease ends. Well, actually, it doesn't end.
- Then they'll be... Ms. Wynn, help me out. So, if we declared that they're noncompliant,
- 2235 then we can go to them and say, 'Hey, you have to vacate provided the terms in the
- agreement. Otherwise, we seek legal action.'
- 2237 **City Attorney Wynn:** We have...
- 2238 **Councilperson McCoy:** However, the other option, if we do declare that they're
- 2239 noncompliant, then essentially, if they wanna stay, they have to sit down at the table.
- 2240 That's exactly what it is.
- 2241 Ms. Wynn.
- 2242 **Chairperson Lanier:** City Attorney.
- 2243 **City Attorney Wynn:** We have to provide them with the reasons for their
- 2244 noncompliance and an opportunity to cure.
- 2245 Mr. A. Fields: Yeah.
- 2246 Councilperson McCoy: Well, we...
- 2247 **City Attorney Wynn:** Within a certain time period.
- 2248 Councilperson McCoy: But...
- 2249 **Chairperson Lanier:** We gave them that. We...
- 2250 Councilperson McCoy: [Stammer]...
- 2251 **Chairperson Lanier:** ...at our last meeting, we had, we had an understanding that
- 2252 all the issues that were brought up at that meeting, would be addressed when then come
- 2253 back before us. And that is a no answer to have all the issues been cured.
- 2254 Councilperson McCoy: Follow up.
- 2255 Chairperson Lanier: Mr. McCoy.

- 2256 **Councilperson McCoy:** So, respectfully, Ms. Wynn, I'm gonna disagree because...
- 2257 [Inaudible dais comment]
- 2258 **Councilperson McCoy:** ...being delinquent is a material noncompliance. So, once
- that occurred, we don't.., there's nothing to cure about being delinquent in rent. Once
- 2260 you are delinquent, that's a noncompliance. So, there's not a provision that we have to
- give them any kind of remedy to cure when they...
- 2262 **City Attorney Wynn:** They are no longer delinquent. They are...
- 2263 **Councilperson McCoy:** Ms. Wynn. Ms. Wynn. When I brought this issue to your
- 2264 attention last year, nobody... And, and this is exactly what happened. When I brought
- 2265 this to your attention, I believe you said to me, or it may have been Mr. Evans, that this
- came up from another Council Member too, so I think it's best to bring it to the body's
- 2267 attention.
- But, at that point, I asked for a ledger. And at that time, I think nobody knew exactly
- that they were delinquent. So, even if we declare at January 1, 2021, they were in
- 2270 material breach, the breach still exists, and that's a, a anticipatory repudiation of the
- 2271 contract. I mean, they've already violated the contract.
- 2272 **City Attorney Wynn:** They cured the breach. We allowed...
- 2273 Councilperson McCoy: [Inaudible].
- 2274 **City Attorney Wynn:** ...them time to cure...
- 2275 Councilperson McCoy: But...
- 2276 **City Attorney Wynn:** ...the breach. And they...
- 2277 **Councilperson McCoy:** But, Ms. Wynn...
- 2278 **City Attorney Wynn:** ...cured it.
- 2279 **Councilperson McCoy:** If we declare that they breached the Lease, the Lease is
- breached. You ca'.., even if you went back and cured, that doesn't.., it doesn't remediate
- the actual infraction.
- 2282 City Attorney Wynn: Yes...
- 2283 Councilperson McCoy: Can you point...
- 2284 **City Attorney Wynn:** ...it does.
- 2285 **Councilperson McCoy:** ...to it in the contract?
- 2286 **City Attorney Wynn:** Yes, it does.

2287	Chairperson Lanier: We will The Alphas have agreed to work with the City in
2288	terms of looking at the Lease. I think that we all have our comments in regards to how
2289	we want to move forward with this. We also understand that there has to be some
2290	changes made. The current contract, where it stands, the way, [stammer] where the
2291	Code compliance is not in compliance at this, at this moment. It has to be cured. We
2292	understand that we want to move forward, we understand that we want to be able to keep
2293	the Alphas as a partner, but not to the detriment of the City.

- So, with that, we will direct the City Attorney to work with the Alphas to come up with an agreement that we can all be happy with and that as we mo'.., as, as we're moving forward, that everybody knows where everybody stands with this project.
- Is there anything else that we can get from the Board at this moment? Alright. Very good.
- 2299 **Mr. A. Fields:** Madam Chair?
- 2300 **Chairperson Lanier:** Thank you, sir. We are going to move forward. You are going to meet with the Attorney and we're going to work out an agreement. Thank you so much.
- 2302 Councilperson Lawson: Ma'.., Madam Chair?
- 2303 **Chairperson Lanier:** Thank you...
- 2304 Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson: Madam Chair?
- 2305 Chairperson Lanier: ...Alphas...
- 2306 Councilperson Lawson: Madam Chair?
- 2307 **Chairperson Lanier:** Hold on a second. Hold on a second. I am not finished.
- Thank you, Alphas, for your work with the City. Thank you for continuing to try and be partners with us, and we hope that we can work this out.
- 2310 Yes.
- 2311 Councilperson Lawson: Thank you, Ma'...
- 2312 [Clapping]
- 2313 **Councilperson Lawson:** Thank you, Madam Chair.
- 2314 Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson: Madam Chair?
- 2315 **Councilperson Lawson:** I know we're trying to move the, the Agenda expeditiously and
- we wanna continue to progress forward but I do wanna hear the closing statement from
- 2317 the Alpha President, Mr. Fields, in reference to how we're moving forward because the

- direction that we're giving to our Staff, I wanna make sure that we are good stewards and partners with the organization.
- And, being that we've asked them to come and present to us, I do wanna give him at least thirty mor second to give his final statement. If that is okay with you...
- 2322 Chairperson Lanier: Thirty seconds...
- 2323 Councilperson Lawson: ... Madam Chair.
- 2324 **Chairperson Lanier:** ...it is. Thirty seconds.
- 2325 **Councilperson Lawson:** Thank you, Madam Chair.
- 2326 **Chairperson Lanier:** Thank you.
- 2327 **Mr. A. Fields:** We have provided financials, and we are more than happy to
- provide financials at any time. Our books are open. We have no secrets. We're not
- 2329 making any money on this property. The utilities are all covered under that price. We
- have maintenance, there's all kind of expenses that are there. Our organization has taken
- 2331 no money from rents to run our programs, or enrich any member of the organization, for
- the record.

- 2352 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Thank you, Mr. Evans. Good everyone. And
- 2353 just to note, the slides were up a little early because we've been having technical issues
- 2354 lately, so we just wanted to make sur that we didn't run through that issue with my
- presentation. So, we apologize if it gave you a sense of a rush, but you have plenty of
- 2356 time.
- But, with that being said, we have now reached the final leg of our special event permitting process project because City Staff has been working diligently to provide for a
- 2358 permitting process project because City Staff has been working diligently to provide for a better permitting process than what has existed in the past. And so, with that being said...
- There we go. In March, we successfully have our special events Ordinance passed, with
- revisions to it, which provides for new special even fees.
- 2362 And so, at my very first presentation, on the first reading, I did say that as part of
- our plan we would come back with a Resolution with the special event fees that we would like to add to what will be called our Special Events Policy and Procedures Manual.
- 2365 [Inaudible audience discussion]
- 2366 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Okay. So, why the fees? So, as you can see in
- the backup material, there are four fees that are being introduced, three of which are
- 2368 mentioned in the new Ordinance, and one of which is being added [stammer] and being
- offered by Staff in addition to those three.
- And, we are requesting for this for two basic reasons. The first being to ensure adequate compensation for services that are not yet covered in the current Special Event
- adequate compensation for services that are not yet covered in the current Special Event Fee Schedule. And then secondly, we also want to curb any unfavorable behavior
- oftentimes experienced with applicants during the permitting process that causes
- 2374 inefficiencies. As stated in my previous presentation, we receive about a hundred and
- 2375 twenty to a hundred and thirty applications a year. So, we wanna make sure that we have
- 2376 things in place to hopefully prevent some of the behaviors that oftentimes can stifle the
- 2377 process.
- Okay. So, I'm just going to basically go over some.., well, all of the fees with you,
- just a brief explanation. So, as I said, there's four fees. The first is the appeal fee.
 According to the Ordinance... so, the appeal fee is a fee that will be applied if the applicant
- 2380 According to the Ordinance..., so, the appearage is a fee that will be applied if the applicant 2381 is denied the, the permit after application due to not meeting the requirements of the
- 2382 application, or any element of the Ordinance or policies. Or two, if the event permit is
- revoked due to violation to the policies. And we're simply asking for a three.., for three
- percent of the security deposit, but not less than fifty dollars, if an appeal is requested by
- the applicant.

The second fee is the rush or priority fee. And, in this instance, this fee would be applied when in the occasion that the City Manager decides to waive the filing deadline for a particular applicant. That, if they're gonna do so, we are asking for the same fee, which is three percent of the security deposit, but not less than fifty dollars. In a scenario where we may see a rush or priority applicant, is when, let's say for instance.., 'cause the current manual will basically state that the new deadline is to supply.., is to provide the application at least sixty days before the event.

Currently, we're doing it at thirty days before the event but, like I've said in previous.., in my previous presentation, that's just not enough time given the breadth of work and the activities associated with the permitting process. So we're essentially expanding that and, if at any point in time the City Manager decides to waive that fee, meaning that Staff will work within a shorter period of time to address that application, then it will be.., we'll apply this fee to make up for the extra constraints, effort, time and attention oftentimes that those scenarios will cause.

The third fee is a date change fee. This is a flat rate, which is just a hundred dollars. So, anytime during the process, after a date, an event date has been established and agreed upon between the City and the applicant, if there's a core request to change that date, we're requesting for a charge of a hundred dollars to do so, and that again is just to compensate for the extra work that's often associated with adjusting the date.

And then lastly, we have a com'.., the cancellation fee. And this is kind of broken down into three subcategories. But the first is more so referencing a refund so, you a hundred percent refund of refundable fees for any cancellation request that's received, in writing, fifty to sixty days prior to the first day of the event.

The second piece is that fifty percent refund for refundable fees, will be submitted to the applicant if their cancellation is received forty-five days prior to the first day of the day.

And then lastly, you have events cancelled less than forty-five days, will forfeit a hundred percent of all fees, deposits and applicable charges. And by refundable fees, we're talking about those nonfinal sale items. So, any permits, licenses or things where a service or product was rendered, that will not be refunded but your security deposit, if you had already paid to reserve for police, fire personnel, facility rentals, things of that sort where you have not yet been given that service, you will be able to, to receive a refund on those items.

And then lastly, what you see here is the Fee Schedule. It's gonna be a quite comprehensive fee schedule. And, it's a pretty important piece to the entire document because, essentially what this is going to allow the applicant to do before they submit an applicant, is basically look at all the fees that are associated with the process so that they can estimate what it may cost them to do an event in the City.

No other city guidelines that I've looked at, and I've looked at close to a dozen of them, actually have a comprehensive fee schedule. And we want to stand out, we want

- to be the example and also assist the applicant in the same way. And so, what we're
- 2427 going to do is that, if this Resolution is passed, those four fees will be added to the existing
- fee schedule. So, where you see at the top left, under general fees, that's where they will
- be added. And, as you can see, there's other fees as well for our Fire Department, Police
- 2430 Department and our Parks facility rentals.
- 2431 And that's about it. So Staff recommends your approval of this Resolution. If you
- have any questions, I'm here to answer them.
- 2433 Councilperson Lawson: Madam Chair?
- 2434 **Chairperson Lanier:** Thank you, Ms. Noel. Councilman Lawson.
- 2435 **Councilperson Lawson:** Thank you, Madam Chair.
- 2436 Thank you for the presentation, Ms. Noel. Are we able to include some additional
- 2437 detailed information for the applicants for events in regards to the Fire and Police
- 2438 personnel? Understanding exactly what the number of required staffing would be.
- 2439 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Right.
- 2440 **Councilperson Lawson:** Because they can't give an ex'.., you can't have an expected
- cost for your event if you don't know what the number of personnel you're gonna be
- required to host.
- 2443 **Assistant to the City Manager Noel:** Right.
- 2444 **Councilperson Lawson:** So, if we're gonna have a specific number, maybe we can
- incorporate that, and make that adjustable based upon our Department or City Manager.
- 2446 **Assistant to the City Manager Noel:** Right. And that's a good point that you made
- because we know that that is an issue sometimes with applicants, is understanding how
- 2448 many personnel do we need and how much will that cost us?
- 2449 **Councilperson Lawson:** Mhmm.
- 2450 **Assistant to the City Manager Noel:** And so, what we can do on the front end at best,
- is at least provide them an idea through the table, for instance. I know for Fire, they
- require that you have a minimum of two Fire personnel. And then, of course, it provides
- 2453 the hourly rate. But, by the end of the day, our special event committee, which in'...
- includes the Fire Department, specifically the Fire Chief or designee, who will then specify
- 2455 how many they will actually need once they actually go through the details of that
- application. Because one person may think I need two, and it's just, you know, a hundred
- 2457 people that'll attend, it's a small event but it's the Fire Department that has the expertise
- 2458 and the understanding to actually provide the specifics.

2459	So then, through that, you know, conversation, hopefully, or meeting with the
2460	applicant, with the special event committee, they can provide them more of an accurate
2461	understanding.

- 2462 Does that answer the question?
- 2463 **Councilperson Lawson:** No, Ms. Noel. The...
- 2464 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Okay.
- 2465 **Councilperson Lawson:** ...concern I have is that we wanna put an expected number
- 2466 attached to how many guests you're going to attend, possible road closures or possible
- concerns that may add additional personnel. 'Cause an event with a hundred people
- versus an event with five thousand people is gonna have a different number of personnel.
- 2469 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Right.
- 2470 **Councilperson Lawson:** So there's no expected amount. So, possibly incorporating
- 2471 into this fee schedule...
- 2472 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Uhuh.
- 2473 **Councilperson Lawson:** ...the number of officers or the number Fire personnel needed
- 2474 for the number of attendants visiting this activity.
- 2475 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Yeah. We can look into that. I can...
- 2476 **Councilperson Lawson:** So that...
- 2477 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: ... see how we can...
- 2478 **Councilperson Lawson:** ...that would be a recommendation, 'cause as of right now, if,
- if we're going to set the precedence, we wanna fill it out comprehensively.
- 2480 **City Manager Evans:** [Stammer]...
- 2481 Councilperson Lawson: And understand exactly what is the expected cost? I know
- 2482 that we're still working on that and it's kinda difficult to assess that. Our, our, our
- 2483 departments heads do that. But, trying to come up with a standard practice so that we
- 2484 can kind of compete ahead of these other municipalities and other facilities that are
- 2485 hosting these events.
- So, I do wanna give them an opportunity to know if they're gonna look at this Fee
- 2487 Schedule, they can know what to expect in regards to that cost. 'Cause it can be a
- 2488 substantial cost if you're talking about thirty-five dollars per officer, when you have a
- variance of ten, twenty officers.
- 2490 **City Manager Evans:** Madam Chair, if I may?

- 2491 **Chairperson Lanier:** Yes. Mr. Evans.
- 2492 **City Manager Evans:** With regards to the cost for Public Safety, we can certainly put
- in what a cost for an officer and, and what the matrix is. My only concern is that if you
- 2494 enumerate it in the actual policy and have a number associated with the amount of
- persons, it then becomes exactly what we have to follow, where we want to have some
- 2496 flexibility that maybe through additional conversations and clarity that's provided by the
- event organizers, that number can shift and modify so, it provides for more flexibility.
- 2498 'Cause, invariably, the most, most expensive element associated with any special events
- 2400 's a second for D. Id's Or for
- is your cost for Public Safety.

And we may also look at a situation whereby an entity may want to have event staff, and then have, you know, law enforcement augment that, to help reduce the cost. And so, I just want us to be very careful with placing it in the Fee Schedule because then

we have to stick to it, and it provides no flexibility.

So, maybe by virtue of it, the application process, there's a preapplication meeting that we provide them with a copy of the anticipated matrix of what the costs are. Because there, there needs to be some factoring into that decision, whether they're gonna have an event in our community because that will make or break an event, as it relates to the financial viability, based on the cost for Public Safety.

- 2509 I just want us to be careful about enumerating it in the policy.
- 2510 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: And...
- 2511 Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson: Madam Chair?
- 2512 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Madam Chair?
- 2513 **Chairperson Lanier:** Hold on one second, Ms., Ms. Noel.
- 2514 **Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson:** On the CRA side, on the Fee Schedule, do they
- 2515 have similar to this, in terms of not putting how many attendees will determine the amount
- 2516 of Public Safety?

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- 2517 **City Manager Evans:** [Stammer] yes. It's, it's very.., it's, it's fluid on the, on the CRA
- side as well. But the CRA.., whatever we adopt here and put into place, the CRA will
- adopt the same type of process to ensure that there's consistency.
- 2520 **Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson:** And when you all... You.., did you look at... I
- know the School Direct has..., they do a lot of... Well, it's not a..., I mean, [inaudible],
- 2522 basically. But, did you check with them in terms... I mean, did you look at other
- 2523 examples?
- 2524 **Assistant to the City Manager Noel:** Other examples. Not the, the School District.

- 2525 **Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson:** Yeah. 'Cause I, I do believe they have it where
- 2526 they kinda put a number there. Maybe just see... I'm sur they won't want.., don't like to
- 2527 get locked in either, but...
- 2528 City Manager Evans: Yeah.
- 2529 Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson: ...if you can just kinda take a look at that and
- see if that's something that may be similar to what Mr. Lawson is speaking of, but not so
- 2531 much to lock us in.
- 2532 **City Manager Evans:** Yeah. We, we can, we can easily put a table on, average the
- 2533 cost is, you know, it's one officer per five hundred persons. But then some flexibility that
- it is subject to change by, you know, the Chief of Police, as this is just an estimate. But it
- 2535 gives us the flexibility to adjust and modify based on further discussions and explorations
- with the event organizer.
- 2537 Director Blankenship.
- 2538 **Parks & Recreation Director Blankenship:** For clarity, we already have that table.
- 2539 **City Manager Evans:** Mhmm.
- 2540 Parks & Recreation Director Blankenship: So, if the event calls for 'x' number of
- people, we have a chart that shows, okay, you can expect this number of officers with a
- supervisor, with this number of vehicles. But it still, like the City Manager says, it gives
- us the flexibility, based on our special events team meeting, to adjust that up or down.
- 2544 But they are given a chart to give some type of idea of what that's gonna cost.
- 2545 **Councilperson Lawson:** Madam...
- 2546 **Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson:** Okay.
- 2547 **Councilperson Lawson:** ...Chair?
- 2548 **Chairperson Lanier:** Yes, Mr. Lawson.
- 2549 **Councilperson Lawson:** Thank you.
- 2550 And, and that's what I was asking for, if we can incorporate that into the actual Fee
- 2551 Schedule, and then just putting a, a notice or note in there to say that...
- 2552 **Assistant to the City Manager Noel:** Yes.
- 2553 **Councilperson Lawson:** ...it can be adjusted by Police or Fire Chief, or department
- heads or City Manager.
- So, just giving them an idea and expectation, and include that with the schedule
- without having us locked in, saving that it's adjustable.

- Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Yep. That's exactly what I was actually gonna follow up with is, similar to how we have it with PD, 'cause I was told that during certain seasons and times, their rates may actually change so we specifically added a note.
- This is still a work in progress. The concept really is to help the individual estimate.

 And if they need to fill out a preapplication, which was something else also that we're

 working on, then they can certainly do that before they invest any monies so that they can

 have a better understanding.
- 2564 **Chairperson Lanier:** Very good. Mr... I'm sorry, Councilman McCoy.
- 2565 Councilperson McCoy: Thank you, Madam Chair.
- Ms. Noel, you said a work in progress. I, I don't know what that means.
- 2567 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: [Chuckle].
- 2568 **Councilperson McCoy:** I mean, is this currently our Fee Schedule or not? I mean, is 2569 it a work in progress or is this already in place?
- 2570 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: So yeah. So, for the most part, the entire, like,
- 2571 the Fee Schedule is final in terms of the numbers, because these are number'..., well,
- except, obviously, the fees that we've presented to you. We're hoping that if you pass
- 2573 the Resolution, those fees will be added to the Fee Schedule, but everything else are the
- ex'..., is..., are the existing numbers that we currently have, and have been using. We're
- 2575 just providing it on this document.
- And, as you heard, there are some suggestions in terms of what we can do to add to our existing Fee Schedules in terms of specifically noting some things that may be more.., may be of more assistance to the applicant.
- 2579 **Councilperson McCoy:** Okay. So, the, the ones that's already existing, how was that established? Because I was looking for a reference to a previous Resolution where the previous fees were adopted, and I don't see any reference of that.
- So, can you give some background on how that was done?
- Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Alright. So, it's... I'm under the impression that there was an approval by the Board in the past. Maybe Mr. Blankenship, since he's kinda
- been participating in this a lot longer than me.
- 2586 **Parks & Recreation Director Blankenship:** Good evening again. Richard 2587 Blankenship, Parks & Recreation.
- 2588 It is my understanding that all of these fees were approved quite a while ago, prior to both my.., my arrival and Ms. Noel's. I have not looked it up, I've taken it on face value, but...

- 2591 Councilperson McCoy: Follow up.
- 2592 Parks & Recreation Director Blankenship: ...that's my understanding.
- 2593 Councilperson McCoy: I...
- 2594 **Chairperson Lanier:** Mr. McCoy.
- 2595 **Councilperson McCoy:** I, I have this real suspicion that this was never a situation
- where fees were established by the Board. This was done Administratively by the City
- 2597 Manager. But, I don't see that this has been something that's been handled by the City
- 2598 Council before.
- 2599 Parks & Recreation Director Blankenship: That's..., [stammer], it's my recollection
- that we provided this to possibly Finance, and they take it to the Board. Or maybe... I...
- 2601 But...
- 2602 [Chuckles]
- 2603 Parks & Recreation Director Blankenship: ...nonetheless...
- 2604 [Inaudible dais comments and chuckles]
- 2605 Councilperson McCoy: Absent of anything... You know, I can only assume that
- because, you know, when we looked at the.., we looked at the policy on street naming,
- 2607 you would've thought that that was done by City Council. It wasn't. That was actually a
- 2608 policy that was executed by Ruth Jones at the time. And, like many of those policies,
- they never actually came to the Board.
- And, you know, I, I kinda wanna take a step back because I don't know that I wanna be in this level of detail. Because the one provision, and I looked at the Resolution. It doesn't speak to anything historical, as to what the current, current fees are. So, that's
- what leads me to believe that there was no prior Resolution.
- Additionally, you know, I'm, I'm all okay for canceliz'..., cancellations, right? And
- that there are Staff time and costs, but there's no provision for force majeure when you
- 2616 have an Act of God or something significant that's beyond the control of anybody that
- happens at thirty-two days out, that literally shuts down like the pandemic did everybody.
- 2618 Parks & Recreation Director Blankenship: Well, that's on...
- 2619 **Councilperson McCoy:** Do we, do we. And this Resolution it's silent on it, but then do
- we assume that, because it's not in here, then that person is entitled to a hundred
- percent? We can't, because it's not explicitly stated here.
- 2622 Parks & Recreation Director Blankenship: But it's in the policy.
- 2623 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Yeah. And...

- 2624 **Councilperson McCoy:** In what policy?
- 2625 Parks & Recreation Director Blankenship: It's not in the...
- 2626 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Well, we'll...
- Parks & Recreation Director Blankenship: ... Resolution but it's in the policy.
- 2628 Councilperson McCoy: See, that's...
- 2629 Chairperson Lanier: Hold on...
- 2630 **Councilperson McCoy:** ...my question.
- 2631 Chairperson Lanier: ...hold on...
- 2632 **Councilperson McCoy:** It's in what...
- 2633 Chairperson Lanier: ...hold on.
- 2634 **Councilperson McCoy:** ...policy? The same policy that nobody can put their finger
- 2635 on...
- 2636 Parks & Recreation Director Blankenship: The one that was approved a few weeks
- 2637 ago.
- 2638 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Can I clarify?
- 2639 Councilperson McCoy: But...
- 2640 **Assistant to the City Manager Noel:** I'm sorry.
- 2641 **Councilperson McCoy:** But, but with... But, Mr. Blankenship, I guess... I'm speaking
- of, you wanna add Sections 1, 2, 3 and 4 to the policy. We're adding it to what policy?
- Obviously, there are already a fee policy somewhere, or a Fee Schedule is out there
- somewhere. And, if there is, how was that Fee Schedule and our fee policy, established?
- ls my, my, my very simple question.
- 2646 **Chairperson Lanier:** Mr. Blankenship, do you wanna answer his question?
- Parks & Recreation Director Blankenship: Well, first of all, as far as how the fees are
- approved. In my tenure, we have brought fees to the Board for approval, as I was of the
- dir'.., of the understanding that that's how it was done, that that was by Charter how we
- 2650 had to do it.
- As far as, [stammer] any other cancellations or any'..., that's all addressed either in
- 2652 the, in the, in the policy or in the Code that we recently passed. But, well, not necessarily
- in what you're looking at tonight because that's just four diff'..., additional fees.

- Councilperson McCoy: Yeah, well, I can tell you right now, this is very much disconnected. Because if you're saying that the force majeure is, is addressed in the Ordinance but we got a separate provision in what we're being asked to pass as a Resolution, we clearly are doing two different things and it doesn't make sense. We can't enforce, or we can't enact half of a policy by way of Ordinance, and then go and a caveat by Resolution.
 - I'm not gonna support this Item. I need to know some history. Like, I mean, I need to know exactly how we initially started those fees. And, here's why, because if you look at everything else, specifically, and I know Mr. Sherman can speak to this, Business Tax Receipts follow the Code of Ordinances. It always has, and that's the process. And you can go back and trace it from the actual Ordinance.
 - And then, when there was something done back in 2008 regarding the change from calling Business License to, to, to Business Tax Receipts, you obviously could follow the change, or the progress. But, you can't.., and I don't know how we can even try to attempt to do this if you don't know where we come from, as far as these fees are concerned.
- 2670 **Chairperson Lanier:** Alright. Thank you, Mr. McCoy, for your comments. Any other thing from you, Ms. Noel?
- 2672 **Assistant to the City Manager Noel:** Yeah. Just, Madam Chair, just one quick note.
- To the note, to the point that Mr. McCoy mentioned about, I guess those Act of God cir'..., circumstances. The policy and procedures manual that I presented at the very first
- presentation, I provided an outline of what that document would contain and, specifically,
- it does have a cancellation policy section, which [stammer], excuse me, specifies what
- our cancellation policy is, to include situations where they [stammer] may be a Act of God
- circumstance. And under those situations, the applicant can move their event, for free,
- in those circumstances, or when the City would have to cancel it, for whatever reasons,
- 2680 <u>i.e.</u>, situations like a pandemic, for, for instance, the City could move those dates or cancel
- the event, but we would be as accommodating as possible to allow them to, to reschedule.
- 2682 **Councilperson McCoy:** Well what about...
- 2683 **Assistant to the City Manager Noel:** So, just to address...
- 2684 **Councilperson McCoy:** ...a refund?
- 2685 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: ...that piece. But, the manual itself is not yet
- published publicly. It's been worked on, on the backend with Staff.
- 2687 Councilperson McCoy: So...

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- 2688 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: But, we provided the outline so you had an
- understanding as to what you can expect in terms of the topics that'll be covered.
- 2690 **Councilperson McCoy:** So, so... Follow up, Madam Chair.

2691 This is exactly why I'm so confused. If you haven't even solidified the manual, you're asking us to give you a key component of what the refund and the fee.., what your 2692 saying is really becoming more convoluted and I can't support this because you're going 2693 2694 to work on something in the.., in what you call the background, but you're being ask us.., you're asking us to publicly approve only four components? 2695 2696 Aside from what's already in place, Mr. Sherman can't, or nobody.., I'm sorry, Mr. Blankenship can't identify where it comes from, you're gonna work on something in the 2697 background, but publicly, us as a Board, are gonna adopt only four items? 2698 2699 Members, this is too convoluted, and we need to send it back. 2700 I vield. 2701 **Chairperson Lanier:** Thank you, sir. Are any other questions from the Board? Council... 2702 2703 Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson: Yeah. Madam Chair? 2704 **Chairperson Lanier:** ...Miller-Anderson. 2705 Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson: So, the part that you're talking about working on, when, when do you expect to bring that back to us as...? 2706 2707 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Yep. So, what I can do is, I can actually meet with you all individually. This is a very large document. You're looking at several pages 2708 to include appendixes, so I can work with you in'.., you know, individually, to go through 2709 2710 that document, before it's publicly released. 2711 And, if you would like, we can then bring it back for a discussion... maybe as a 2712 discussion Item, because it's something that's being done so more so under operations. But, we can bring it back as a discussion Item at a meeting, if that's what you prefer. But, 2713 I can meet with you individually to kinda go through it, getting the other suggestions you 2714 may have, that we can bring back to the group at large, or the team, the special events 2715 2716 committee specifically, to maybe incorporate some the suggestions. 2717 **Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson:** But in terms of the items, the fees that you 2718 brought before us tonight, those... 2719 **Assistant to the City Manager Noel:** Right. 2720 **Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson:** ...are the only things that you're asking for us to approve so that you can insert it into the larger document that you have? 2721

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that, and then you will at least be able to put that, along with the other...

So, we could possibly, at least give approval on

Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Correct.

Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson:

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- 2725 Assistant to the City Manager Noel: Yep.
- 2726 **Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson:** ...stuff that you have. And then you.., if, if the
- Board feels they need to see the rest of the stuff, then that, that would fine with me. But,
- if we're, we're only talking about these fees here, I, I mean...
- 2729 **Assistant to the City Manager Noel:** Yeah. Just the four.
- 2730 **Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson:** I'm fine with that. With approving this part
- 2731 tonight. If that other stuff is already in place, I mean, if it's been there forever and nobody
- ever knew or questioned it before, I would imagine that, that's something that can be

This evening I'll be presenting to you an Item.., actually, it was a request from Mr. Earl Pleasant that the City consider releasing a mortgage, a promissory note and a restrictive covenant from a property that wherein the City granted him \$297,000 in order to construct a building, located at 2701 President Barack Obama Highway. The loan was actually an EDI grant that the City received from the Department of HUD. The transaction took place in February of 2011.

2957 However, there was a condition that [inaudible] occupancy was the date that would be triggered in order for the restrictive covenant to become effective. That date was July 2958 the 16th of 2012, so there is approximately fifteen months left in order for those security 2959 2960 documents to be satisfied. Mr. Pleasant is asking if you would please consider releasing those security documents now so that he can go ahead and... I believe he's about to sell 2961 the property. It's my understanding that, even if he does sell the property, it will continue 2962 2963 to be used as a commercial property. And I believe there are no other conditions besides 2964 those, the use of the, the property to remain as a co'.., a commercial use.

And Mr. Pleasant is here in the event that you have any questions. Staff is just asking if you would please give us direction as to how to move forward.

- 2967 **Councilperson Botel**: Madam Chair?
- 2968 **Chairperson Lanier:** Yes, Councilwoman Botel.
- 2969 **Councilperson Botel:** So, the mortgage has been satisfied and there's no.., there's nothing else owed to the City? It's just a matter of releasing the restrictive covenant?
- 2971 **Assistant City Manager Jacobs:** No, ma'am. The, the mortgage has not been
- 2972 satisfied.
- 2973 Councilperson Botel: Oh.
- 2974 **Assistant City Manager Jacobs:** There is a time period. What, what would trigger
- 2975 the satisfaction of the mortgage would be the ten-year requirement that won't mature until
- July of next year. So, he's about fifteen months out, in terms of the mortga'..., mortgage,
- 2977 excuse me, actually maturing. So, what you can do is, you can release the mortgage, but
- 2978 it's not technically satisfied. What you would do is release it, if you decided to do so.
- 2979 **Chairperson Lanier:** Any other questions?
- 2980 **Assistant City Manager Jacobs:** Mr. Pleasant is here as well if you would like to
- 2981 hear any comments from him with regards to what he intends to do with the property.
- 2982 **Chairperson Lanier:** Yes. You can provide that to us, Mr. Pleasant.
- 2983 **Mr. E. Pleasant:** Okay. My name is Earl Pleasant. I'm a citizen of Riviera Beach since
- 2984 1961. I graduated John F. Kennedy High School, I served in the military. I bought
- 2985 property on A.C. Evans in 1975. I'm a resident since 1975.

This is my blessing ceremony at Pleasant Plaza, which was the, the first new retail construction in Century Center in more than twenty years. What didn't happen is, the reason I'm trying to, to sell the property. This is a letter, and Deirdre, would you read this letter for me, please?

2990 Assistant City Manager Jacobs: Sure.

For the record, the letter reads: To who it may concern, I am Earl Pleasant, the proprietor of Pleasant Plaza, located at... For the past years, I have maintained the property, mainly at my expense. Although the units at the property have been successfully rented for the last year, there have been breaks in occupancy. There have also been substantial repair cost due to an improperly sealed roof, and [stammer] and inadequate HVAC units.

During this period, I was able to maintain the property and incurring costs due to income from Earl Pleasant Tile, my primary source of income. So, when COVID-19 caused my.., caused our economy and our communities to shut down, I was forced to shut down my tile business as well. As a tile contractor, I work in residential homes and businesses but social distancing and stay at home orders that become impossible.

Even now, as the country and our community reopens, I have few opportunities for work, which greatly impacts my ability to cover costs and maintain the property. COVID-19 is an undeniable cause of concern for me and my business, however, it is not the only factor.

Over the last few years, I have also had to deal with some underlying health issues that have contributed to my inability to work, primarily having a knee replacement and, most recently, having eye surgery, have spent time away from my tile business to recuperate.

lt is due to these factors, these major factors, that I request the option to sell the property, known as Pleasant Plaza. Although I have only fifteen months left on the contract, I believe now would be the best time for me to sell. I currently have a buyer who has shown great interest in purchasing the building. The potential buyer has an occupant in one of the units from the opening, and has been consistent in paying their rent. Therefore, I ask that you consider my quest to sell the property.

- **Mr. E. Pleasant:** And I also [stammer] spoke with Mr. McCoy, and he had some, I believe he had some remedy. If he would state those remedies? If he...

There was a provision in the agreement that you provided to me that calls for an assignment. And I did bring it to the Manager and the Assistant Manager's attention yesterday about exercising the option of allowing you to assign your interest over. And, I believe Ms. Jacobs, your response was that the mortgage has been satisfied, but it hasn't been released. Correct?

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Assistant City Manager Jacobs: No. Actually, I went back and reread it this afternoon. The mortgage and.., the mortgage and the promissory note, as well as the restricted covenant, they all call for the fi'.., July, July 16th date, in order for the property to be.., for any of those documents to be complexly satisfied.

So, the only way to actually assist Mr. Pleasant with getting rid of any of those documents, would be for you to release those documents absent the fifteen months, or if he decided to sell the property, you could still release the mortgage and allow the res'.., restrictive covenant to remain on the property for the business to continue to stay there and operate [inaudible].

Councilperson McCoy: Well, well... And I appreciate your analysis, but specifically, in his [inaudible] it provides him the right to do an assignment. So, whatever interest he has, he can go to whoever his seller is and assign it right over to him and that person assumes the same provisions that he would have normally had to meet, the mortgage and the restrictive covenant, and all of it. So that's why I offered Mr. Evans and Ms. Jacobs the options of doing the assignment.

But, but here's what I wanna suggest at this point, Ms. Wynn, and I want your attention on this. Being that this is probably going to be a sale that you're gonna have to do a title..., title work on, it would seem to me, and Ms. Wynn, I want some direction from you, if this is gonna be something that you're trying to consummate a sale, I think, perhaps, going into negotiations and figuring out exactly what the title company will accept... Oh, I'm sorry. I forgot I got the realtor right next to me. I mean, if they want to stipulate..., if you can get a release from... I, I wanna make sure whoever this is on the end, whoever your buyer is, can get the exact language. Because I don't think we should take action before the title company says, 'Well, you got a release, but I want a satisfaction.'

So, I wanna make sure that it works without us taking action first and if they into neogt'... Ms., Ms. Wynn, you're nodding your head, but I'm hoping that we can actually figure out exactly what the title company will accept to consummate the sale. As opposed to us taking action and you go to the title company and find out if they want it done a different way.

That would be my recommendation, because that would really shortcut it altogether, in my opinion. If that, if that is [inaudible].

Chair Pro Tem Miller-Anderson: Madam Chair?

- 3291 elements that ensure better safety for those that are attending meetings here. And, all
- 3292 that in the backdrop of COVID-19 and making sure that we're compliant with social
- 3293 distance requirements, et. cetera.

There is some thoughts with regards to enumerating some of these changes in a written policy, as well as looking at what other communities are doing and how they

handle safety and security of all persons that would be attending the meeting.

So, Staff would like the opportunity to have a more robust discussion with the Board, looking at public safety at, not just our City Council meetings, but at some of our City facilities. Florida statute does allow for us to go into what would be considered a shade session to talk about security elements whereby we have the privacy to have

discussions about some safety procedures and protocols, and things that we would like to put in place, especially with some of our new facilities that will be coming online here very soon. We do wanna have the discussion with the Board as to access points, who has access, scantrons, what are.., what's the appropriate way to handle the security of our visitors to our community, and our residents, as they access some of our City facilities.

So, that is kind of the backdrop of the entire conversation. We've done some things to modify the, the safety protocols but nothing that comes into policy. So Staff's recommendation would be to have a, a shade session with the Board to talk about security, holistically looking at all our different facilities and entry points into our community.

And then, from that discussion, then bring back some policy recommendations for adoption and consideration by this Board.

Chairperson Lanier: Are there any questions or comments from the Board in regards to this? I want us to move forward with this security issue. Not just for, for the, the Board itself, but for the public in general, coming into this building and any of the City facilities. We understand that people coming into this building have to be.., go through a metal detector, and that should be for everyone. So I want us to be able to have this conversation about, not only having the security for the public, but for Board Members as well.

But, what I want to do is, I want to have this discussion so that we can look at some of the legal ramifications. There has to be a policy that we implement ourselves and how we're going to move forward, ensuring not only the security of the public, but of the Board Members themselves.

And there's not a day that doesn't go by that I don't think about it, and I know others in the agency don't, don't think about it.

And so, we certainly.., our thoughts and prayers are with the family. He was a remarkable young man, and we were fortunate to have hi m as, not just an employee, but a friend of this agency, and a resident of this community.

And, thank you, Mr. Mayor, for reading the Proclamation and doing the Proclamation for Mr. Holland and his family. And, we certainly look forward to seeing our community and that family as they go through the grieving process and being there to support them and our fellow co-workers.

Because the challenging part is that the, the things that those employees were exposed to and, and what they went through, they're not programmed to be able to, to process that as Public Safety is accustomed to seeing those things. And so, I'm really concerned about those employees and, and we're trying to facilitate as much support and assistance as we can for them, and, and for the agency as we look to, to process this.

And so, to the, to the family, know that' you're, you're loved one is, is loved and respected and admired by many people and I'm fortunate to have the opportunity to have worked alongside with him. And, certainly you know that we're always here to assist in any conceivable way.

So, I just wanted to take that time to, to recognize the, the life and the legacy of a phenomenal human being and a [stammer] phenomenal young man, and he certainly will be missed by this agency and this community.

So, the event that is occurring this weekend has complied with the COVID guidelines, has submitted a COVID plan, and has been approved by all the appropriate parties. It is a event on CRA or City property, but it is a private event, that is a ticketed event, but they have complied with what the requests of Staff have been.

Other events that you will also see happening, there's some other events that will be occurring, I believe Jeeps on the Island, as well as a triathlon as well, that will be occurring in our community. Both those events had to comply with COVID restrictions. And a lot of these events, realistically, are just doing the event to continue to have their, their staple events in the community, and start moving into some form of normalcy. But they are doing a lot of work and spending a lot of dollars as it relates to ensure the safety of all persons that are at the event.

of all persons that are at the event.

3537 If you do feel uncomfortable or you have any questions, obviously, there's going to be event coordinators and Staff that's going to be onsite to assist and, and provide any 3538 clarity that persons may have. But, I think the event organizers have done a good job on 3539 3540 making sure people are safe and masks are provided, and the like.

So, they do have to submit an.., a, a.., they have to go through a pretty extensive process that's approved by Staff before they can even have the event, so it is compliant with... And I think some of them have reduced their capacity to at least fifty percent of what they've done. Even more, so maybe even seventy percent of what they've done in the past as it relates to their events.

- 3546 Councilperson McCoy: Madam Chair?
- 3547 **Chairperson Lanier:** Yes, sir.
- 3548 Councilperson McCoy: So, Mr. Evans, on those reduced capacity events, do we 3549 reduce our fee that we charge those folks? Because obviously, if you got a ticketed event,
- and this solely for the purposes of them being able to, you know, admit a certain number 3550
- 3551 of people, have we adjusted the prices?
- 3552 City Manager Evans: We haven't adjusted the prices for events. And, and we
- actually looked into what other entities are doing. There isn't a situation where they're 3553
- 3554 reducing prices, but one of the things we do wanna come back and have the discussion
- 3555 with the Board, is their opportunity to co-sponsor events, whereby, by co-sponsoring, you
- 3556 know, certain hard costs that the event organizers are used to absorbing, would be
- 3557 absorbed by the City.

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- So those are some things that, you know, we would bring back in another 3558 3559 discussion with the Board to try to lure and retain some of the events that we have here in the community. But there's no reduction in fees that have been offered to those event 3560 3561 organizers.
- 3562 Councilperson McCoy: Follow up? And...
- 3563 **Chairperson Lanier:** Yes.
- 3564 Councilperson McCoy: ...and, and then, Mr. Evans, I don't know if you have the
- answer, but you remember we did the fencing in Park & Rec. Is that being offered a part 3565
- of these packages and these deals that these folks are... 3566
- 3567 **City Manager Evans:** I can't speak on specificity, but as it relates to the fencing that
- 3568 was acquired, but I know that the event that's occurring this weekend, there is some
- fencing that is being utilized in areas that are being sectioned off because I know I've had 3569
- 3570 conversations with law enforcement as street closures and some of the things. So they're
- 3571 really confining the spaces that they'll be utilizing. But I don't know if they're utilizing the
- fences that we have, or if they got it from a private provider. 3572
- 3573 **Councilperson McCoy:** Thank you.

Chairperson Lanier: Thank you.

With that being said, my comments include a clean'..., Great American Cleanup, April 17th, 8:00 a.m., 928 7th Street. This is a cleanup that I'm doing in conjunction with the [stammer] Riviera Beach CDC and CRA. And this is going to put some focus on the areas of 1st through 7th Streets in Riviera Beach, on that side of town where we want to be able to start doing new homes and getting first-time homebuyers involved in that area.

The second item is, of course, you heard the Reentry Program, the Reentry Month is April 13th, here at the Marina. We have the Reentry Awareness Night. That will include a, a, a, a movie and a panel discussing our reentry for Riviera Beach.

The third thing is that, as you all know, that since I've been sitting on this Board and before that, I have been very, very vocal about the traffic on 13th Street. And I'm sure you've heard this a hundred times, but we are still working on trying to make sur that these large, overlarge [stammer] trucks are not coming down 13th Street. We had a community meeting about two weeks ago in regards to this issue.

There are about three or four options that the, the committee..., not the committee but the community came up with. They include everything from partial road closure to permanent road closure, to traffic circles, to signs to chicanes. And we're gonna have, next month, another community meeting in the community, actually, actually in the community, on the street to be able to get people in that neighborhood involved in making a decision about how we're going to traffic calm that area.

And, of course, the fourth thing I want to speak about before I sign off, is the crime in Riviera Beach. I live in Federal Garden, and there have been a significant amount of shootings in this area in the past week or so. And, I want to be able for this community.., because I know that the police cannot do it by themselves, but what we have is a nerveracking issue for everybody who lives in the City, and specifically, in my neighborhood. It has gotten out of control. And we need to be able to address the crime in this City. I don't know what we need to do, but we need to do something. This has gotten ridiculous. I am nerve-racked with Police, Fire, EMT down my street every single day.

People who don't live, you know, who live maybe way out from the City, don't hear these sirens and these firetrucks and these EMTs every day, twice a day. It is nerveracking. And something has to be done. And I want this community, I want the Police Department to be able to come up with [stammer] some solutions about what is happening in this City because we cannot get anybody to come and move here, we cannot get anybody to bring their children to school here, if we are having this continuous shootings and crime in the City. And I want, not just the Police, and not just more Police, but the community to get involved in how we're going to address this issue.

And you will be hearing something from the Chief, and from the City Manager, about this issue because something has to be done. It is enough for me. It, it, it's been enough. And I want the community, and not just say more police and not just say the police should do it, this has to be a community issue. Period. There are more than one
