Dear Lou:

City of West Palm Beach Resolution # 270 - 13 established the below method of charge for the City administering the IPP program. This is the method that was agreed upon when City staff met with Riviera Beach staff and Lake Worth staff. I believe you and Mr. Mario Loaiza attended this meeting which included Ms. Rene Mathews, Mathews Consulting, the City's IPP consultant.

Ms. Nancy Urcheck, Deputy City Attorney worked with Mario and I believe a Riviera Beach attorney on the language that would be acceptable to your utility board. This is the language below.

The City of Lake Worth approved the IPP contract which includes this methodology for payment. We also sent a contract to Mario last year for your consideration and approval. Which to date has not been approved. We need to get this resolved as soon as possible. We (our IPP staff) have been providing serves to industries in Riviera Beach for some time without compensation back to the Utility.

If you decide you would rather have your own IPP program we can assist you in this transition If not, we really need to get the contract approved and payment/invoice for services rendered by the City of West Palm Beach paid.

Resolution 270-13 states:

Charge for Administration of Industrial Pretreatment Program(s)

The rate per industrial user will be calculated by dividing the jurisdiction's industrial pretreatment program operating budget by the total number of industrial users in the jurisdiction's system. The charge to the jurisdiction will be calculated by multiplying the number of industrial users by the rate per industrial user.

Please let me know how you would like to proceed.
