**Economic Development Agency  
Minority Business Development Agency Business Center Program**

The MBDA Business Center program provides funding to identify, screen, promote, and refer minority business enterprises (MBEs) to exporting resources, and to expand exporting. The Project also provides technical assistance and business development services to generate increased financing, contract opportunities, and greater access to new and global markets for MBEs. This is a rolling application and awards ranging from \$100,000 to \$3 million in funding.

**Administration for Children & Families  
Community Economic Development Projects**

The Administration for Children & Families (ACF) will award approximately \$17.7 million to Community Development Corporations (CDC) for well planned, financially viable, and innovative projects to enhance job creation and business development for low-income individuals. Grants will be made as part of a broad strategy to address decreasing dependency on federal programs, chronic unemployment, and community deterioration. CED projects create employment opportunities that lead to increased self-sufficiency for low-income individuals through activities such as capital expenditures including the purchase of equipment or real property, allowable operating expenses, and loans or equity investments. CED funds a variety of projects including business incubators, shopping centers, manufacturing businesses, and Healthy Food Financing Initiatives. **The Application Deadline is April 28, 2017.**
