# United States Conference Of Mayors/ Scotts Miracle-Gro Company GRO1000 Program

One of the focus areas is: Food Deserts; providing access to fresh healthy foods. Four winning cities will each receive \$40,000 in cash and product and the **Application Deadline** – **November 15, 2016.** 

## **Economic Development Agency Minority Business Development Agency Business Center Program**

The MBDA Business Center program provides funding to identify, screen, promote, and refer minority business enterprises (MBEs) to exporting resources, and to expand exporting. The Project also provides technical assistance and business development services to generate increased financing, contract opportunities, and greater access to new and global markets for MBEs. This is a rolling application and awards ranging from \$100,000 to \$3 million in funding.

### Administration for Children & Families Community Economic Development Projects

The Administration for Children & Families (ACF) will award approximately \$17.7 million to Community Development Corporations (CDC) for well planned, financially viable, and innovative projects to enhance job creation and business development for low-income individuals.
